Presentation on Procurement Bill 2023-20

Lawsikia Hodges, OGC, gave the third installment of her presentation about the changes to the Procurement Code proposed in Ordinance 2023-20. Ms. Hodges talked about implementing an electronic procurement system and electronic records and notices. She discussed the procurement operations manual and reorganizing the Ordinance Code to remove outdated sections and relocate certain sections. Ms. Hodges spoke about the procurement operations manual timeline, if 2023-20 is approved. The manual will take roughly 6-9 months to finalize, with an effective date for Procurement Code changes of 2.1.24.

Dustin Freeman, Chief of Procurement, spoke about potential amendments to 2023-20, including a local business preference policy and using the City's sales tax exemption as an incentive suggested by CM Gay.

CM Pittman explained the purpose of the bill.

Phillip Peterson, Council Auditor's Office, explained the amendment.

CM Peluso asked about certain affordable housing entities, such as the Historic Eastside Community Development Corp, being included in the initial round of the donation period, even if they do not meet the small entities criteria. Lawsikia Hodges, OGC, said there has been discussion about including some organizations with long standing experience with affordable housing development, like Habitat for Humanity.

CM Boylan asked why the initial donation period is not open to all nonprofits.

CM Pittman said the goal is to provide smaller entities to be able to compete with larger groups, particularly private developers.

CM Pittman mentioned requiring attendance at the workshops for any entity that receives donated property. Ms. Hodges said that may be adopted as a rule by the Chief of Housing and Community Development.

CM Freeman asked about 2023-93-E, which disposed of 9 properties to the Eastside CDC without going through the standard surplus property disposition process. Mary Staffopoulos, OGC, explained that the referenced donation was completed using an Ordinance Code waiver, and that if similar circumstance occur in the future the Code could be waived the same way.

CONCERN

This amended agreement authorizes 100% of the City funding to be provided to Mayport Waterfront, Inc. in advance as opposed to on a reimbursement basis. While the amended agreement will require evidence that the prior payments have been fully expended by Mayport Waterfront, Inc. before the next installment is paid, the advancement of 100% of funding is not standard for City Grant agreements.

Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment.

CP Salem provided some history for this project and the Mayport Waterfront organization.

CM Carlucci spoke about the historical value of the Mayport Village area.

Mr. Peterson explained the Auditor's concern related to advance payments, which is not the standard for City grants.

CM Peluso spoke about revitalizing the area, and setting a standard for advance payment exceptions.

CM Gay concurred about determining rules as to how and when advance payments are permissible. CM Boylan shared similar concerns.

Mr. Randolph, OED, described the Mayport Waterfront group and how it is run by dedicated volunteers.

Daryl Joseph, Parks Director, was in attendance to speak on behalf of the bill.

There was some discussion on this bill, particularly on the \$162,000 appropriation for council district 9 projects because the district lines have changed since the initial legislation in 2019. There was a debate as to whether those funds should still go towards district 9, or district 7 based on the new district map. CMs Peluso and Clark-Murray will hold a noticed meeting to work out those details.

CM Boylan proposed a floor amendment to remove the \$162,000 appropriation, but retain the funding for the Head Start facility at the Emmett Reed Community Center.

The floor amendment passed unanimously and will be rolled together with the original amendment.
