Chairwoman Pittman convened the meeting and the attendees introduced themselves for the record.

Presentation on status of on-going and upcoming FDOT projects - Jim Knight, FDOT

Jim Knight of the Florida Department of Transportation made a presentation on the department's 5-year work program for District 2 (Northeast Florida) for FY24-28. He noted that the new 5-year plan for FY25-29 will be adopted by FDOT in the next 2 weeks, which will be somewhat different than what is being presented today. That plan is still subject to changes until officially released. There is almost \$2 billion of projects on the work program for Jacksonville for FY24-28. He briefly described several of the larger and high priority projects scheduled for work in Jacksonville in the next several years. Mr. Knight said Northeast Florida has a large number of road miles to maintain but lower population density than other parts of the state, so is at somewhat of a disadvantage in the funding formula compared to more densely populated areas. He described the process by which the District 2 counties submit their projects for the district for submittal to the FDOT, which further refines the list based on connection to other ongoing or planned projects, funding availability, etc. and establishes the final project list.

CM Gay asked about several specific projects in his council district, their funding sources and construction timing. He asked for details on delays on several projects, particularly the widening of North Main Street. Mr. Knight explained that funding comes in several distinct pots which cannot be shifted to other uses and noted that state law requires resurfacing of roads on which the pavement reaches a certain condition, which is mandatory even if major work on that roadway is planned in the next few years. President Salem asked about the reason for poor pavement condition in several areas that have been repaved, but not completely (i.e. half an exit ramp paved, the other half not paved). At the request of the Chair, Mr. Knight described the relationship between FDOT and the City with regard to maintenance agreements. FDOT provides state-standard maintenance on all of its facilities, and a city or county that requests enhanced features on a state road (i.e. decorative pavers, fountains in retention ponds, enhanced landscaping, etc.) must enter into an agreement to maintain those extra features itself.

CM Matt Carlucci commented on the poor quality of FDOT maintenance of major roadways (tall grass, litter, debris on bridges, road shoulders, underpasses, etc.). Mr. Knight said FDOT has 2 maintenance contracts for state roads – one for the interstate system, the other for all other state roads. The contractors are major national companies that are fully responsible for maintaining their roadway segments, from mowing to litter control to pothole patching. He invited council members to contact him about any problem areas which he will refer to the proper maintenance personnel.

Public Comment

Carnell Oliver said 2023-20 has the potential to move the City forward. Transparency is key, and citizens need to be able to see how much money is going into each district and how it's used. He advocated for prohibiting organizations employing council members from receiving any City funding.
