Presentation by Ross Hammock, FDOT

Ross Hammock of Florida Department of Transportation gave a presentation on Bridge Safety.

He explained that bridges are inspected every two years, with the exception of movable bridges that are inspected yearly. About \$18 million a year is spent on bridge inspection and maintenance.

He described the safety features to prevent and mitigate the damage of collisions. There are two major types of anti-collision safety features: fender systems and dolphin systems. Fender systems are like "guardrails" on a highway; they can redirect and absorb contact to avoid collisions but could likely not prevent collision if a large enough vessel collided with the fender system head-on. Dolphin systems are large concrete structures, usually located at bridges near port facilities frequented by larger vessels, built at the base of bridges' support structures. However, even these systems would not absorb the full momentum of a head-on collision.

Mr. Hammock presented information on the Dames Point Bridge, which was completed in 1989 an includes fender and dolphin systems as well as an air gap monitoring system that helps vessels know whether they are able to safely fit underneath the bridge.

He stated that Jacksonville is a maritime city and that all bridges in the area have been designed with that in mind. However, accidents can still happen, as did with the collision at the Matthews Bridge in 2013. The maritime coordinator has great responsibility in preventing accidents from occurring, and the presentation concluded with the message of "don't fit -- don't commit" for vessels.

CM Miller asked whether FDOT was considering any updates or renovations in light of the tragedy in Baltimore regarding the collapse of the Francis Scott Key Bridge. Mr. Hammock responded that there were no current plans and that the risk of this type of tragedy occurring in Jacksonville was low, although the increasing size of vessels does increase risk. CM Miller noted that it is important to be as safe as possible and that he would like to see an analysis of what types of vessels travel through the St. Johns River system. Mr. Hammock noted that the largest vessels tend to not travel further south than the Dames Point Bridge, as the channel depth would not support vessels of that size any further south.

CM Howland asked how vessels are made aware of the data provided by air gap monitors, and Mr. Hammock answered that NOAA provides real-time readings of this data. CM Howland asked whether there is any way to stop traffic if the air gap monitors deem the situation on the bridge unsafe, and Mr. Hammock stated that FDOT would rely on the help of JSO to help stop traffic.

CM Clark-Murray asked who specifically monitors the air gap monitor readings and communicates to other agencies when it is unsafe, and Mr. Hammock stated that he did not know the exact procedure but that all can see the reading in real-time. CM Clark-Murray expressed interest in seeing a representative from the port community to discuss these procedures.

CM Peluso asked who originally funded the installation of the dolphin systems; Mr. Hammock answered that JTA paid for their installation, but FDOT now had responsibility for these systems. CM Peluso asked why the dolphin systems were only present on one side of the support structure at certain bridges; Mr. Hammock answered hat dolphin systems are placed in the areas that have the highest risk of seeing a collision. CM Peluso stated that he believes that the City and State should have conversations with the Coast Guard and Army Corps of Engineers to discuss plans to harden

infrastructure.

- City will apply to FDEP for grant funding and commits to undertake a future project to acquire and develop approximately 57 acres adjacent to Naval Station Mayport
- Property would be open to the public for passive recreation and access to the water
- Grant would require the City to complete recreational improvement within 3 years
- The US Navy has committed to paying 50% (\$625,000) of the acquisition cost at closing
- The nature of the emergency is that the deadline for the Program grant application is April 15th

CM Peluso noted that Brian Burket had given a presentation on this grant application and project to the Jacksonville Waterways Commission and expressed his support for the bill.

He noted that these efforts would require coordination of city, state, and federal government officials. He expressed that the Matthews Bridge might soon need to be replaced.
