Chairman Howland convened the meeting and the attendees introduced themselves for the record.

# Presentation by Procurement Division on single source awards approved during second quarter of FY 23/24

Dustin Freeman, Chief of Procurement, gave a report on single-source procurements during the second quarter of the fiscal year which total 17, including 15 purchase orders and 2 purchase order agreements. President Salem asked if the \$392,000 allocation for replacement mattresses in the jail was related to the \$9 million the council appropriated for immediate jail improvements. Vice President Randy White said he did not believe this appropriation was related to that funding source.

Fiscal year-end financial recapture report

Council Auditor Kim Taylor said the Council Auditor's Office and Finance and Administration Department have discussed and agreed on this report. The report shows a recapture of \$7M of General Fund dollars from other funds substantially supported by the General Fund, to be allocated to reserve funds and to backfill any funds ending the year with negative fund balances. The recaptures to the General Fund will come from 6 funds – Property Appraiser, Kids Hope Alliance, Solid Waste Disposal, Information Technologies, Radio Communication, and Public Buildings Allocation. Ms. Taylor noted that the report recommends recapturing \$850,000 of the General Fund's \$11.9 million loan to the Solid Waste Disposal Fund. The General Fund's net loan to Solid Waste stands at \$31.65 million as of the year-end closure on September 30, 2023.

Council Member Joe Carlucci said he will be exploring how big the City's operating reserve fund should be, as he understands it currently amounts to nearly 20% of the annual General Fund budget. There may be good uses of those funds for current needs instead of continuing to build the reserves ever larger. Chairman Howland, Council Member Lahnen and Council President Salem cautioned that the City is looking at several very large upcoming capital projects (stadium renovation, new jail) and needs to be saving for those expenses. Council Member Lahnen asked when the next debt affordability study will be released; it is due in May.

# Audit report: #824A - Follow-up on Capital Assets Audit

Ms. Taylor distributed and discussed her office's recently released Report #824A - Follow-up on Capital Assets Audit. She noted that 4 of 15 issues originally identified remain outstanding as of this first follow-up. They include: 1) the need for random inventory checks, 2) no deadline for timely reporting of the addition of new assets, 3) failure to report lost or stolen assets to the Council Auditor's Office as required by the Ordinance Code when they are reported to JSO, and 4) failure to record state-required information in the City's financial management system. In response to a question, Director of Finance and Administration Anna Brosche said the state law sets a value threshold of \$5,000 for an asset to be recorded. The Mayor's Budget Review Committee will be looking at a proposal to increase the City's threshold from the current \$1,000 to match the state's \$5,000.

Council President Salem invited Cindy Funkhouser, CEO of the Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, to describe the purpose of this appropriation. She said it will fund a grant consultant to seek additional funding for the Mental Health Offender Program (MHOP), now in its fourth year, which keeps low-level offenders with mental health issues out of jail. The consultant, who ran the very successful MHOP program in Miami, has already helped secure a \$3.2M grant to the City and will be looking for more grant opportunities. The program has been very successful to date in meeting the needs of the mentally ill and in getting them housed and connected with needed services outside of the criminal justice system.

1 -Nay: Carrico The committee debated which amendment to move, the Rules Committee amendment or the NCSPHS Committee amendment, which differed over whether to have the study acquired via an RFP process rather than a direct contract. At the request of Council Member Carrico, Ennis Davis of Community Planning Collaborative, the proposed single source provider, explained his background with the Durkeeville area via a previous U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development HOPE 6 study and his strategy for pursuing this study in collaboration with the Durkeeville community. In response to questions, Mr. Davis and Council Member Peluso described the results they expect from the project. President Salem said that he is not opposed to single-source procurements if the single source is uniquely qualified to perform the work, which should be carefully reviewed in each instance.

Council Member Arias asked about the possibility of cost overruns and what would happen with the results of the study when it is completed. Chairman Howland noted that the City has made other investments in the Durkeeville area in recent years. Council Member Freeman said his cause has been to fight for economic prosperity in all communities because there are pockets of need all over the city. Every district has needs that ought to be addressed and he urged all district council members to be vigorous advocates in seeking funding for the needs of their districts. Council Member Gaffney Jr. said the use of the President's Contingency Fund for this purpose sets a precedent for others to ask for the same thing for their projects. Council Member Pittman said her district has had plenty of studies done – what is needed is funding for action to implement them. She suggested the need for a special committee on how to revitalize the neighborhoods encompassed in Council Districts 7, 8, 9 and 10.

The Rules Committee amendment to procure the services via a direct contract was approved 6-1 (Carrico opposed).

CM Arias asked how the Jacksonville House Authority would develop their 37 lots in the study area, by building housing itself or by using private developers. Council Members Peluso said the JHA would have to answer that question, as they have done it both ways in other areas. Mr. Arias said that private developers who get the benefits of building projects with City assistance such as free land should reimburse the City a portion of its contribution that made the project possible.

- The loan will be secured by a second priority mortgage on the property of the multifamily component of the project
- The proposed loan is a result of a settlement agreement entered into between the City and the parties associated with the proposed Southbank self storage development. The settlement agreement requires consideration of the loan request, but does not require Council approval.
- The settlement agreement also requires consideration of a request for a \$600,000 local preference loan (this has been approved by DIA and will be funded concurrent with the development's receipt of a certificate of occupancy)

Phillip Peterson explained the request for the emergency and the amendment. Council Member Gaffney Jr. asked about the number of programs involved and whether all are summer programs. Nicoa Garrett of the Grants and Compliance Division said there are 35 programs that will be in effect from June through September. Council Member Arias said he objected to the food and beverage waiver for these programs when they aren't approved for other programs. Chairman Howland noted that a similar appropriation was made last year for the same type of summer programs but it was on a 50% advance payment/50% reimbursement basis; this year is 100% advance payments.

#### NCSPHS AMENDMENT

- 1. Include a waiver of Section 118.301(a)(3)(iv) to allow for grant funds to be expensed for costs of amusements, social activities and incidental costs relating thereto, such as meals, beverages, lodgings, rentals, transportation and gratuities up to a maximum of \$2,000
- 2. Correct scrivener's errors
- Appropriates \$300,000 to be distributed to 35 specifically identified non-profit organizations that have met the selection process requirements and were selected for funding by the Safety and Crime Reduction Commission
- Waives Sec. 118.107 to allow for a direct contract with the 35 specifically listed non-profit organizations that were not selected through a competitive award process in accordance with Chapters 126 or 118
- Waives Sec. 118.201(f)(7) to allow for advance of 100% of the award amount to grantees
- A one cycle emergency has been requested in order to execute contracts with grant recipients and have services in place by the start of summer

#### **CONCERN**

Advancing the entire amount to each entity puts City funds at an enhanced risk and limits the City's ability to monitor the use of grant funds during the term of the agreement. If the grantee does not comply with the terms of the agreement, the City would have to claw back funding as opposed to withholding subsequent payments.
