- Updates the terms to refer to cannabis (rather than marijuana) and includes a definition consistent with changes in state law which took effect on July 1, 2019
- Ties the fine structure for the civil citation to Chapter 609 fine schedule (Code Enforcement) rather than a separate fine schedule
- Specifies that fine revenue will be deposited into the Duval County Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Trust Fund

CM Carlucci asked what the substitute changes are and how it affects the bill. Paige Johnston detailed the substitute for the Committee. CM Dennis discussed the burden on the Sheriff's Department when having to use police resources on arrests for the possession of 20 grams or less of marijuana. He described specific cases from the packet he handed out to the Council Members. CM Dennis explained this bill as a third alternative for the police officer to use at their discretion in giving a civil citation instead of an arrest.

CM Gaffney asked Undersherriff Ivey the opinion of the Sheriff's Office on the proposed bill. Mr. Ivey questioned the numbers of arrests referenced by CM Dennis solely for possession of 20 grams of marijuana. Mr. Ivey stated that he belived it was much lower, because a lot of those arrests have other charges connected to the arrest. Mr. Ivey stated that for 2018 the number of just 20 grams or less marijuana possession arrests were 237. Mr. Ivey argued that the 1,400 number cited by CM Dennis was most likely connected with shoplifting, speeding or other charges with the marijuana possession being an additional charge. CM Gaffney asked Public Defender Cofer his opinion of the bill. Mr. Cofer stated that

he did not believe the Council has the authority to provide a seperate remedy under the State Law, but the Council has the authority to create an independent municipal ordinance of a civil nature. This impacted the initial amendments to the bill. Mr. Cofer clearly stated this will not impact the State law. Undersheriff Ivey explained that the Sheriff does not support this legislation because he feels it is a slippery slope towards decriminilazation and that should be left in the State's hands. CM Newby said he could not support the bill because it did not have the support from law enforcement. CM Priestly-Jackson asked how this legislation will impact the volume of cases created from marijuana arrests. Mr. Cofer stated that it will all depend on how it is used at the discretion of the Sheriff's Office. If it was used by the Sheriff's Office that would lessen the amount of cases. CM Dennis said he understood the Sheriff was not comfortable with decriminalization language and that was the reason he changed it to a civil citation. CM Dennis asked about hemp and if there is any confusion in the Sheriff's office in regards to arresting for marijuana when it is actually hemp and the ability to test the two substances. Mr. Ivey said he cannot think of one example where an arrest for marijuana was actually hemp.

Summary:

This bill will authorize the execution of a Redevelopment Agreement for the design and construction of a parking garage within the Downtown Northbank Community Redevelopment Area (CRA). The City will convey an approximately 2.3 acre parcel generally located at the corner of Magnolia Street and Forest Street ("project parcel") to Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Florida ("developer") at no cost by quitclaim deed. The project parcel has a current appraised value of \$3,170,000. Developer proposes to design and construct a parking garage having at least 750 parking spaces at an estimated cost of approximately \$21.0 million. The bill also authorizes a Restrictive Covenants and Parking Rights Agreement which will allow the parking garage to be available for public parking after 6:00 pm on weeknights and 24 hour use by the general public on all weekends and national holidays for a term of 39 years.

Prior to closing, the City will fill-in the existing retention pond located on the project parcel with fill dirt, remove existing pipes and drainage structures, and restore the surface of the project parcel. The City has budgeted in the proposed FY 19/20 CIP to complete this work as part of the Brooklyn Area Drainage & Safety Improvements project. In the event the developer fails to commence construction of the parking garage by March 31, 2020, title to the property shall revert to the City should the City exercise its right of reverter.

The City will make a Parking Garage Grant in the amount of \$3,500,000 to the developer upon substantial completion of construction of the garage. The Parking Garage Grant is planned to be made from the Downtown Economic Development Fund. In the event the developer does not substantially complete construction by March 31, 2021, the City may elect to:

- 1. Repurchase the property from the developer at its then appraised value, less the amount of \$3,170,000 (the current appraised value), or
 - 2. Require the developer to pay the City \$3,170,000

In the event the developer sells or otherwise transfers the project parcel within the first five years from the date of disbursement of the Parking Garage Grant to an entity that is exempt from paying ad valorem real property taxes on the project parcel, the developer shall pay the City 1) the \$3,500,000 Parking Garage Grant and 2) the \$3,170,000 appraised value of the project parcel.

In the event the developer sells or otherwise transfers the project parcel six to ten years after the disbursement of the Parking Garage Grant to an entity that is exempt from paying ad valorem real property taxes on the project parcel, the developer shall pay the City the Parking Garage Grant on a proportionately reduced basis.

The total estimated City investment in this project includes the following:

- Conveyance of the City-owned parcel (\$3,170,000)
- Work on the project parcel (\$1,100,000 \$1,400,000)
- Parking Garage Grant (\$3,500,000)
