CM Carlucci asked when will the bill go into effect if it was passed today. CM Cumber detailed that the amendments are just techincal in order to make sure they conform and the bill would shut establishments immediately that are using these machines. CM Cumber passed out a call for service log from JSO covering June 1st to September 16th that are focused on the gaming locations. CM Cumber gave an overview of the crime that has been committed over that time in this gaming locations. CM Morgan asked how many active COU's are out there? Brian Hughes, Mayor's Office, stated that when this was taken up by the last Council there were 181 businesses using the simulated gambling machines, 25 of which didn't have a COU. Of the 25, 8 had been in process of getting a COU. 10 businesses have been shut down and the rest are under an appeal process. CM Gaffney asked about the legality of these machines. Jason Teal, Office of General Council, detailed the public nuisance component. Mr. Teal also clarified that this bill doesn't shut the businesses down. It will just say that the simulated gambling devices have to be removed, but bingo and video games are allowed. CM Carlucci expressed concern about the impact this could have on people losing their jobs at these arcades. Senator Audrey Gibson told the Committee that it sets a bad precedent to allow these businesses to continue to run illegally. CM Morgan voiced her support of shutting down simulated gambling machines, but she believed that the previous Council's bill that gave a timetable to shut down the gambling machines in February was already she moved to defer the bill which failed. CM Priestly Jackson asked about the COU and Mr. Hughes said that it is a certificate to run a business. During public comment many employees and customers of arcades in Jacksonville voiced their opposition to the bill. Nekea Sanders is a small business owner that is a neighbor to an adult arcade and she voiced her support of the bill.
