CM Dennis was in attendance to speak about this bill, noting that hemp is now legal in Florida and there are no state approved test kits which differentiate between cannabis and hemp. CM Dennis also spoke about the negative and long term consequences which occur when an individual has a criminal record. Public Defender Cofer was present and said that a criminal record, even for possession of small amounts of cannabis, can prevent individuals from finding/retaining employment and bar them from federal student loans and grants. CM Diamond said he would support the bill only if the Sheriff was in agreement. CM Diamond also asked about the effect on federal grants if civil citations could be given for the possession of small amounts of cannabis. When asked by CM Dennis to report back on any issues with federal grants, Brian Hughes, CAO, said he would find out how other cities with this kind of cannabis policy have been impacted. CM Boylan expressed concerns about marijuana and impaired driving, as many of the arrests for possession occur when vehicles are pulled over by law enforcement for some other infraction. Mr. Cofer said that if this bill passes, law enforcement's discretion would not diminished and that they still would have the

full authority to make arrests for DUI, if applicable.

Further Discussion

After the agenda business was complete there was further discussion about Council Rules and Ordinance 2019-566 (which pertains to JEA pension plans):

Per memorandum from CP Wilson, the Rules Committee has been charged with reviewing various Council Rules. CM Diamond presented background on the potential conflict between Rules 4.602 (voting is required and if council members refrain from voting, it will be counted in the affirmative) and 4.605 (proxy votes are prohibited). There was discussion about who/how the affirmative vote would be registered if proxy voting is prohibited, as someone would actually have to press the vote button. It was proposed that Legislative Services staff could do the vote, but not all committee members agreed with that course of action. More discussion on these Rules, and selected others, will be forthcoming.

There was also discussion about 2019-566 which seeks to provide JEA employees a buy up provision whereby JEA will purchase service credits (years of service for retirement purposes) for employees, which would only be effective in the event of a Recapitalization Event. Several CMs spoke about the possible sale of JEA and the effects on the city. This bill is not up in front of the Rules Committee, but CM Morgan wanted to discuss it anyways. While such a discussion about a bill not in front of the committee is unusual, it is permissible.

Sherry Hall, JEA, said that this bill will provide comfort to JEA employees who may face uncertainty over the possible sale of JEA. Kyle Billy, Council Auditor, explained JEA's retirement benefits and any changes this ordinance would bring. Mr. Billy said that one concern associated with a Recapitalization Event would be that the City would be responsible for any and all pension benefits for JEA employees and pensioners.

CM Priestly Jackson cautioned that good decisions aren't made out of fear, noting that this matter needs to be referred to the Rules Committee for a deeper discussion. Valerie Gutierrez, Business Manager of IBEW 2358, said that IBEW has negotiated this pension package with JEA and urges its passage because of the security it will provide to JEA employees regarding the future of their pensions, and that this pension provision is a part of the collective bargaining agreement that will be coming to the City Council shortly for ratification. CM Priestly Jackson asked why if this matter was collectively bargained is it coming to Council as a bill separate from the collective bargaining agreement ratification bill. Sherry Hall said it is because all changes to the pension plan must be adopted by separate legislation in addition to being in the CBA.
