EMERGENCY/AMEND/APPROVE

(Rules Amendment)

There was a lengthy discussion on this bill, which appropriates \$5,000,000 of CARES Act funds previously appropriated in Ordinance 2020-235-E to reimburse the city for the cost of the Building Inspection Fee Moratorium. Instead those funds will be directed to help local residents impacted by COVID 19 economic effects.CM Dennis was in attendance as the bill's sponsor. CM Newby proposed an amendment to specify that the funds would go to the mortgage/rent relief program, which was approved by the committee. Several council members spoke of the urgent need for financial support amongst their constituencies. When asked about the amount of applicants on the waiting list, Joey Grieve, CFO, said he would report back. The funds to be provided by the CARES Act have not been received yet by the City.

- 3. Include the relief program guidelines from Exhibit 2 of 2020-235-E which are as follows:
 - Designed to assist individuals and families struggling to meet monthly obligations for mortgage, rent or utility (water, gas or electric) payments due to wage loss from the COVID-19 crisis
 - City will make one-time payments of up to \$1,000 for mortgage, rent, and utility payments
 - Eligibility criteria include:
 - o Must live in Duval County
 - o At the time of application, annual household income must not exceed \$75,000 a household is defined as the family occupying a specific residence. If such residence has only one individual occupying it, then that individual makes up the household. If there are more than one adults living in a household together, then only one adult may qualify for funding for the household.
 - o Must have documentation reflecting employment as of February 29, 2020 (may show paystubs, bank statements reflecting direct or indirect deposits or letter from employer that includes salary or typical wages earned in a 2 week period)
 - o Since February 29, 2020, have experienced a reduction in hours of work or pay reduction by 25% or more as a direct result of the COVID-19 crisis
 - o Must sign a certification that you meet all eligibility requirements
 - o Must fill out and sign a W-9 form
 - o Must sign a certification that you have received the debit card

Peggy Sidman, Office of General Counsel, provided a status update on the council rules which had been the focus of the Rules Committee this year. Topics included: voting procedures when absent from chambers, substitute motions, "friendly" amendments, adding names to bills as a co-sponsor, point of order, public speaker cards, widowed bills and withdrawal motions.

CM Newby and Ms. Sidman discussed the process for getting legislation added to the addendum of the agenda for council meetings. Essentially, if a bill is submitted after the deadline (Wednesday afternoon of committee week) then the council president may decide to put it on the addendum or wait for the next cycle.
