Council Member Hazouri asked for an explanation of the reason for the deferral. CAO Brian Hughes said that there was a series of grants involved in the acquisition of the Metropolitan Park property and this bill could buy out one of the grant encumbrances. The administration needs more time to negotiate with National Park Service and hold this funding in reserve for potential use depending on the outcome of the talks. He said that no progress on any projects would be held up by deferring the bill today.

Council Member DeFoor said she sympathizes with the JEA employees but sees this bill as an incentive to help sell JEA, which she opposes, particularly the sale of the water operation. Council Member Salem said he sees a lot of confusion and misunderstanding about what this bill does and how it relates to a potential JEA sale. CFO Joey Greive explained the projected \$132M incremental cost to the pension plan calculated by the actuarial impact statement. Another evaluation will be done at the time of any sale and the City would be paid and made whole for that amount. In response to a question from Council Member Hazouri about who will be ultimately liable for the future pension benefits, Mr. Greive said the City is liable for the payments but the sale contract for JEA would require that the proceeds make the Ctiv whole with an actuarial amount transferred to the pension fund. Kyle Billy distributed a 3 page list of analysis and concerns produced by his office. He said this bill does not provide for payment of the UAAL (unfunded accrued actuarial liability) attributable to JEA employees after a recapitalization event. The City will bear all liability for dealing with the UAAL and that should be dealt with in this or future legislation. He also recommends reducing the assumed rate of return on the plan's assets from 7% to 6% because the City will be solely responsible for the plan if JEA is sold and should be planning from a conservative position. His office is waiting on 2 additional pieces of information that have been requested. Mr. Greive said that the pension plan's total liability is about \$1 billion today, and the future pension sales tax will pay off the UAAL over time. A portion of the proceeds from a sale of JEA could be applied to paying off the UAAL earlier than the sales tax would do it.

In response to a question from Council President Wilson about whether a City employee who goes to JEA tomorrow will get the same benefit under this bill that the current long-term JEA employees would get, Mr. Greive said they would. CAO Brian Hughes said that somebody will always win and lose when a plan changes benefits on a specific date – that's just life. Council Member Cumber expressed

support for the bill to protect the employees from whatever may happen with the ITN; this is Council's opportunity to say that employee protection is important and lock it in now. She feels it is too early to start talking about earmarking sale proceeds for one use or another because we have no idea what a sale would produce. Council Member Freeman cautioned against allowing a desire for the perfect to be the enemy of good, and feels this is a good protection for JEA employees. Council Member Bowman express concerned about council members' comments impacting the potential interest of parties in pursuing a purchase of JEA, which could have "cone of silence" implications with regard to the ITN. Rev. Fred Newbill, Vice Chair of the JEA board, said the JEA board voted unanimously to let management explore potential recapitalization options, but no decisions have been made yet. This legislation will help alleviate employee concerns of the employees about their pensions and only triggers if a sale eventually takes place.

Council Member Pittman said it is imperative to protect the employees on the front end. Council Member Hazouri said he supports the bill to protect the employees but feels it should be referred to more committees so more council members get to participate in the debate, since this is Council's only real opportunity to say anything about a JEA sale until a deal is negotiated. The Council needs to be included in the process before that end decision is made. In response to a guestion from Council Member Salem about who makes the decision on a 6% vs. 7% rate of return assumption, Mr. Greive said normally it's set by the Pension Board. In this case a decision will need to be made about using the sales proceeds to pay down the UAAL if that's what the City wants to do. He said the JEA's actuary (also the City's actuary) will do a calculation at the time of a sale to determine how much needs to be covered at that time. Council Member DeFoor asked for clarity about the relation of the pension sales tax proceeds to this decision. Mr. Greive said the city will decide what to do with the JEA sales proceeds and that a portion could be used to supplement the sales tax proceeds and end the tax earlier - maybe as much as 10 years early. The sales tax will currently pay for the full UAAL over 30 years - an infusion of JEA sales revenues could shorten that time frame. Kyle Billy noted that the pension liabilities will be paid with a combination of sales tax revenues, employer and employee contributions, and the investment earnings of the assets - it's all a package. Mr. Hughes said that every time there's a substantial change in the nature of the plan, a new actuarial study is done to determine how to keep the fund actuarially sound. In response to a question from Ms. DeFoor about whether the administration is 100% confident that the sales tax will pay the pension obligations if JEA employees are pulled out of the plan, Mr. Hughes said yes, because the Mayor has committed to use at least \$1 billion of JEA sales proceeds to pay off all BJP bonds and shift the sales tax to pension purposes earlier than 2030.

In response to a question from Council Member Salem about the uses of this appropriation, Grants Administrator Damian Cook said that it will continue the Cure Violence pilot project in the two current target areas on the Northside and Eastside for another year. Early indications are that the initiative is having a positive impact, but it's very early in the process and more time is needed to see the true effects. Council Member Hazouri asked how long will it take to get the next progress report and what measures will be used to determine success. Mr. Cook cited 2 measures – murder and non-fatal shooting statistics, and positive community feedback and enhanced feeling of safety. Council Member Pittman said she likes the program and the intensely local focus with neighborhood buy-in, and is glad to see investment in forgotten neighborhoods. Council Member Freeman expressed concerned with how the providers are being selected and said he wants to see more than the usual agencies at the table providing services. In response to a question from Council Member DeFoor about how long it will it take to really get a handle on the data, Mr. Cook said they have looked back at 3 years of crime date to establish a baseline and will have good data to review in a year, but are starting to see progress already. Council Member Salem said that mediation sessions and community meetings are OK as an initial measurement, but a decrease in shootings and murders is the real measure for success. He requested an update to the Finance Committeee in 3 months on the initial trends and data indications.
