Her biggest issue was the density.

Public Participation

Ed Lukacovic, Planning Department, detailed the bill which is a small land use amendment. The bill was first looked at by the Planning Commission on March 5th and City Council March 10th. Mr. Lukacovic detailed the land around the development area which is tied in with Ordinance 2020-148. The proposal is a land swap, giving up 2.37 acres of conservation at Goodbys Creek Preserve for 52 acres of area in Goodbys Creek. Mr. Lukacovic detailed the area surrounding the location and went over pictures of the property. Commissioner Hardesty said that once he learned about the project and found out that the Riverkeeper was in support of the plan that he become also supportive of the plan. Commissioner Devereaux voiced his concerns that this was not a good deal and his worries when looking at the appraisal value. Commissioner Devereaux said that in 2001 the City paid \$190,000 for the property and wondered how it is a good deal that this land swap would be for land valued at \$15,000. Mr. Lukacovic said the representative from Real Estate that will come up for the following corresponding bill could better explain.

Public Comment:

John Nooney read the bill and ask where all the groups are to talk about the conservation efforts. Michael Balanky, Developer, detailed the project and the work done with the Riverkeeper to cover the resiliency part. Mr. Balanky said that in every way this project will enhance the property. Commissioner Devereaux

asked who is getting the better economic deal in this project. Mr. Balanky said that he believes it is a win-win for the developer as well as the City of Jacksonville. Renee Hunter, Chief Public Works Real Estate Division, explained that the price of the land would be lower then the 2001 purchase price because there is now a conservation easement that was not there at the time of purchase in 2001.

Discussion of the Ft. George Inlet

Jason Harrah, Project Manager & Florida Supplemental Program Manager, Water Resources Branch Programs & Project Management Division, Jacksonville District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, detailed the area and the impacts to the Ft. George Inlet. Mr. Harrah went over the PowerPoint and detailed they have just started the first part of the project which is the study. He detailed that the focus is on stopping the erosion and working to restore the area. Mr. Harrah went over the schedule of the project and the timeline of the study. He also gave a detailed history of the erosion and the possible solutions to the erosion. Chair Ferraro asked how many people showed up to the public meetings on this issue. Mr. Harrah said that about 30 to 40 people showed up, but only 3 or 4 of them were from the general public while the others were representing organizations. Mr. Harrah said that the sand will continue to erode and this could become a continuing project to maintain.

Discussion of "Proclamation of Boater Skip Day" - Commissioner Haskell & Commissioner Brockelman

Commissioner Haskell thanked Commissioner Brockelman and Susan Grandin, Office of General Counsel, for their help with the Proclamation. She said that there has been thousands of people already interested in Boater Skip Day.

Discussion of the Derelict Vessels/Floating Structures Committee – Commissioners Brock, Devereaux, Commissioner Adkison

Commissioner Devereaux went over the meeting which had the Sheriffs Office representation and other partners. Mr. Devereaux said that the biggest issue is the enforcement through the regulation of floating structures. Mr. Adkison said that the committee has done great work, but also stressed that there needs to be a budget attached to the action. Commissioner Brockelman gave an update on legislation in the State Legislature and that Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission will receive \$3 million for derelict vessels recovery.

8. Public Comment

Ken Doria detailed issues he is having in his neighborhood that covers 12 lots near Clark's Fish Camp. His issue is that Jacksonville has an easement for drainage in the area and now there has been so much silt and debris that you are unable to navigate the canal. Commissioner Brock suggested a special tax district, so that the maintenance of the canal could be paid for through the tax. Commissioner Birtalan suggested a Special District and detailed how he had done that successfully. Adam Hoyles said that dealing with the septic systems in the area is a greater problem than just the canal.

John Nooney talked about the Charter Revision Commission and that the Chair of the Commission is also on Waterways. Mr. Nooney is asking for a Charter Amendment that any waterway that has public funding should have public access.
