Following the agenda overview, Chair Salem turned the floor over to Jessica Shepler, Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA), for a presentation regarding the JTA Door to Store program. Ms. Shepler provided an overview of JTA's Door to Store pilot program. The JTA program allows customers to call for a ride to and from participating grocery stores and supermarkets. Ms. Shepler touched on multiple topics, including initial program planning, expanding the program to seven (7) new stores, the program's launch in 2/1/2020, and the program's social media activity reaching over 345,000 community members. Ms. Shepler provided a list of organizations and community groups that have worked with JTA for marketing outreach of the program. Statistics regarding the program's ridership were presented and Ms. Shepler noted that ridership through the COVID-19 pandemic remained relatively steady. The pilot program's budget is \$95,000.00 for the first year of operation. To date, the program has spent \$47,000.00 of the allocated budget. Following the presentation, Chair Salem opened the floor to questions.

Council Member Morgan shared her support of the program and asked if the program had to stop or be significantly augmented during the COVID-19 pandemic. Ms. Shepler said that the program has remained active during the pandemic noting that all JTA services are maintaining social distancing practices, following CDC suggested PPE guidelines for JTA operators and requiring mask usage for all JTA services.

Council Member Gaffney shared his support of the program and asked about funding for the program following the first year of operation. Ms. Shepler said that JTA plans to get through this first year of the program to assess if the allocated budget is sufficient to cover the program's operation costs. Ms. Shepler said that JTA anticipates continued partnerships with the City to provide future funding of the program.

Chair Salem asked for details about the procedure for picking up and dropping off customers to and from grocery stores. Ms. Shepler explained the procedures for the typical two-way transport, but noted that there are occasionally customers that use the service to be dropped off at one of the participating grocery stores and do not use the service to go from the grocery store back to their home. Ms. Shepler said that there have been discussions within JTA about requiring customers to book two-way transportation in advance, but noted multiple mitigating situations that would make the requirement impractical. Chair Salem encouraged Ms. Shepler to reach out to some of the customers that only used the service for a one-way trip and ask them about how they completed their trip or made their way home. Chair Salem asked if JTA is tracking the wait times for customers using the Door to Store service. Ms. Shepler said that JTA does track the wait times and includes that specific data in their monthly reports to the City and that she will forward that information to the committee members. Chair Salem thanked Ms. Shepler and invited her back for future presentations.

## PH APPROVE

COMMENTARY: With no speakers present, Chair Salem opened and closed the public hearing for the bill. Eric Fuller, Public Works Department, provided an explanation of the bill noting the proposed location and scope of the applicant's yard waste removal service and that all applicable requirements have been met. Council Member Ferraro asked if there are any residential homes near the proposed location. Mr. Fuller said that there are no residential homes in the vicinity and that the neighboring property owners have no issues or concerns regarding the proposed location. Council Member Morgan asked about the number of these types of facilities within the City. Mr. Fuller said that there are five (5) facilities within the City dedicated to handling yard waste and noted that there are other facilities that can handle yard waste such as landfills and mixed-waste processing locations. Council Member Morgan asked if there is a limit to the amount of yard waste facilities that can be accommodated within the City and how is the limit set. Mr. Fuller explained that the process is based upon the applicant. The applicant submits an application, it goes through various departments within the City to make sure requirements are met, then the application is sent to the Council to decide if there is a civic need that necessitates the additional service. Council Member Morgan posed the same question to John Pappas, Public Works Department, asking if there is a limit to the amount of yard waste haulers within the City and whether or not research has been conducted to see if the need for an additional service is present. Mr. Pappas said that his department has determined that the addition of recycling facilities to the City is beneficial because of the added overall recycling capacity for the City and the subsequent benefits of added recycling. Council Member Becton asked if the business is a free enterprise business with no relationship to the City other than operational services. Mr. Pappas confirmed that the business is a free enterprise business. Chair Salem asked about permits, fees, and inspections relating to the yard-waste hauling facilities. Mr. Pappas and Mr. Fuller said that the Certificate of Necessity is the five-year permit, explained the other various fess, and noted that the facilities are inspected monthly by the City.

COMMENTARY: With no speakers present, Chair Salem opened and closed the public hearing for the bill. Eric Fuller, Public Works Department, explained that this bill is very similar to the previous bill and that the main difference is the type of waste being hauled. The bill is for clean concrete waste. Council Member Becton opined on the positive relationship that the applicant's current business has with his Council District's community members and the overall benefits of recycling concrete.

## APPROVE

COMMENTARY: Robin Smith, Public Works Department, provided an explanation of the bill noting that the grant funds appropriated are being used to reimburse City staff for planning and work conducted within the Bay Street Innovation Corridor. Council Member Cumber asked for the total cost of the project. Mr. Smith said that the project is funded and operated through the Department of Transportation and the City staff were only used for initial engineering designs. Mr. Smith said that he estimates that the City staff time will cost well over the \$10,000 allocation, but the allocation will help to pay some of the costs. Council Member Cumber asked if there is a way to calculate the additional staff time costs in excess of the \$10,000 being covered by the grant funds. Mr. Pappas said that the Public Works Department does track staff work hours and will get the figures to the committee at a future time. Council Member Ferraro asked about the flood sensors that are being installed within the Bay Street Innovation Corridor. Mr. Smith said that there are approximately six (6) sensors within the areas that are incorporated into streetlights and storm manholes that are triggered when stormwaters reach a certain height. Council Member Ferraro asked if other areas within Jacksonville have been targeted for the installation of these flood sensors. Mr. Smith said that the Bay Street Innovation Corridor is the pilot for the flood sensor program, but noted that other areas of the City will benefit from these sensors if the pilot is a success.
