Presentation on Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for Fiscal Years 2021/2022 through 2025/2026 Contact: Wanda Forest

Wanda Forest, Transportation Planning Manager at TPO, gave a presentation of the upcoming projects in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Fiscal Year 2021/2022 through 2025/2026. CM Ferraro asked if the work being done at Wonderwood Drive was being done by TPO or the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT). Autumn Martinage representing FDOT said the projects will be done predominately by FDOT. CM Morgan asked about the Arlington Expressway and to discuss the projects in more detail offline. CM Salem asked for more information regarding the timelines to be sent to the council members.

Presentation by John Pappas, Public Works Department - Recycling Report follow up

John Pappas, Director of Public Works, gave a PowerPoint presentation of the Annual Recycling Report from the Fiscal Year 2019/2020 to follow up with the TEU Committee. CM Salem spoke about the importance of education when it comes to recycling. Mr. Pappas answered pre written Council Member questions. CM Ferraro asked about what goes into the cost per ton. Mr. Pappas said it is based on the processing fee which is up to the collection agency and how it is processed and Trail Ridge Landfill is where the contaminates are disposed of. CM Gaffney asked if recycling is taken outside of the county to be processed. Mr. Pappas said he did not know, but that the \$58 a ton processing fee is what is paid to the contractors.

CM Dennis explained the bill which would help create funding for derelict vessels. CM Morgan asked what kind of funding currently exists. CM Dennis talked about the current funding structure through FWC and that this fee could help raise about \$250,000 to \$300,000. Brian Hughes said there is development going towards fixing boat ramps that have been damaged. CM Ferraro stated that the Waterways Commission voted against the bill and he has heard only opposition towards the bill from the boater community. Mr. Peterson clarified that the dollars collected would come to the city with one dollar going to the Manatee Protection Fund.
