CM Becton explained the bill and the reason for the emergency which would allow the bill to travel on the same timeline as the gas tax legislation. The bill would be an alternative to raising taxes. Phillip Peterson explained the amendment. CM Becton talked about the timeline of projects in the city. CM Cumber asked what impact this legislation would have on impacting future projects in the city. Jordan Elsbury, Chief of Staff Mayor's Office, said that the CIP will be at capacity if the gas tax is passed.

CM Becton said with this legislation he is trying to make the same commitment as he did with septic tanks in order to show that infrastructure could be made a focus without raising taxes. CM Ferraro asked what the capacity is of Public Works to be able to work on more projects. John Pappas, Public Works, said he does not have a specific number, but did say they would be comfortable doubling the funding going towards resurfacing and could raise the capacity for sidewalk repairs. Mr. Pappas said the capacity is mostly based on the construction industry's capacity. CM Carrico asked if this money could be directed towards the Emerald Trail. Mr. Petterson said yes and clarified that any project over \$100,000 would have to come back before the Council to be approved. CM Becton clarified that this bill aims to send a signal to show a commitment to move forward with infrastructure without raising taxes. CM Cumber went over the possible funding sources for projects in the city from local funding or federal funds. Brian Hughes, CAO Mayor's Office, clarified that none of the covid-19 federal relief money has been given back to the federal government.
