Susan Grandin, Office of General Counsel, explained the bill which removes the limitations on public parking from 11pm to 6am in the commercial zoning districts. The Planning Commission disagreed with the Planning Department's recommended amendment. CM Dennis gave the historical background which led to the need for this change in code to allow for parking in the area. Chair Salem moved forward an amendment to exclude zoning districts CCG-1 and IBP from changing their current parking limitations. Laurie Santana, Planning Department, said she is not sure of the reason for the zoning code, but she would look into it. CM Becton worried about the unintended consequences of the bill. Paige Johnston, Office of General Counsel, clarified that this legislation is for off-street parking lots. Steven Diebenow, representing the Lote Group, said that from discussions regarding the community's feelings on the parking amendment the only worry was having people sleeping in their cars at night. Bill Killingsworth, Director of Planning and Development, explained the reasons for the suggested amendment by the Planning Department.Mr. Killingsworth suggested that by amending part 3 to make the parking permissible by exception when it is not adjacent to a residential zoning district and permissible by exemption through part 4 when it is adjacent to a residential zoning district for CCG-1 and IBP. This was voted on and passed as an amendment to the amendment and then the amendment as amended was voted on and passed. CM Cumber suggested an amendment which would add there shall be no sleeping, parking or storage for more than 24 hours which would prevent tent living in the lots. The Cumber amendment was approved and then was voted to be rolled together with the previous amendment as the TEU amendment. CM Dennis asked if anyone would like to co-sponsor the bill when it moves to LUZ. CM Gaffney said he would co-sponsor the bill.

Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment. CM Becton asked who owns the garages that the city will be purchasing. Mr. Peterson said the city will be purchasing them from MPS and the cost is defined in the default clause which returns the original investment of \$3 million and the estimated outstanding bonds for the construction of the garages.

- This bill authorizes the issuance of debt for the purchase of the three parking garages commonly referred to as the Sports Complex, Arena, and Courthouse garages from Metropolitan Parking Solutions (MPS).
- The purchase price consists of a return of equity of \$3 million to MPS and paying off bonds totaling \$29,905,000.
- Per the Treasury Division, based on current market conditions, the City could issue debt and realize a NPV savings of \$4.9 million over the life (approximately 10 years) of the outstanding bonds.
- Under the current agreement:
- Any cash shortfall in operating expenses, bond payments or MPS' guaranteed return from parking garage revenue is funded by the City in the form of a development loan.
- The City contributes (via the Northbank Downtown CRA) approximately \$4 million annually to MPS in the form of development loans.
- Based on the current contract the City is required to continue to make the annual contribution for approximately 10 more years until the bonds issued by MPS are paid off.
- The current cumulative amount of development loans plus interest is more than \$70 million and continues to grow annually. The City does not anticipate receiving payment of the development loans as reflected in the City's audited financials.
- The current non-default cash purchase price would be an estimated \$50 \$55 million plus the forgiveness of the loans.
