Brian Hughes, Chief Administrative Officer, talked about the current facilities which exist in Jacksonville and how many vaccinations have been given. Mr. Hughes said that at the local level there have been 11,925 vaccines done at the two sites. There is also a site through the Florida Health Department which is located at the Prime Osborn Convention Center, and the Department of Emergency Management is running a site at Regency Square Mall. There are currently two city run sites and two state run sites. Mr. Hughes said that the capacity to distribute more doses exists in Jacksonville, but the issue is that there are not enough vaccines. They are waiting for more to be distributed to the state from the federal government. Mr. Hughes emphasized that Covid-19 vaccines are two doses for each person, so that half of the supply needs to be held to make sure there is availability when the second dose is needed. Mr. Hughes said that currently the City does not have any more first doses. Mr. Hughes said that the best place to get updates regarding vaccines is to go to the JaxReady website.

Julia Davis, Office of General Counsel, explained the amendment which was outlined in a handout which detailed the revised contract with FSCJ for Operation Boost. CM Diamond said he could not support the bill because he will not support any bills that come from the Social Justice Committee. CM Bowman said that the current unemployment rate is 4.8% and that there are already a lot of programs out there to address unemployment and he believes those should be focused on more instead of investing in smaller programs. CM Becton echoed the statements of CM Diamond and CM Bowman and talked about a running water issue in his district and said that is the most important issue to him. CM Freeman said his issue with the process and felt that there is a breakdown in process regarding the way the bills come forward through the Social Justice Committee. CM Freeman asked how much money is left in the Social Justice Committee Contingency fund. Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, detailed that there is \$1.6 million left in the \$2.8 million Social Justice Committee fund.

CM Newby said that he believes the unemployment issues are much greater on the north and west side of Jacksonville and then talked about the goals of Operation Boost and why it is such a valuable program. CM Gaffney voiced his

support for the bill and asked to be added as a co-sponsor. CM Freeman asked to be added as a co-sponsor.

Public Comment:

CM Becton talked about 2020-759 and voiced his concerns with the steep penalties on business and property owners. CM Freeman suggested having a noticed meeting to give more clarity on this bill. CM Bowman and CM Diamond explained why they have withdrawn their co-sponsorship of the bill.

Carnell Oliver talked about the importance of job training that is focused on low-income areas.

John Nooney talked about the Beach Boulevard boat ramp that needs repair and issues regarding public access to the waterways.

Council Auditor's Office Bill 2020-529

Summary of 2020-529 (Six-Month Window for Normal or Early Retirement):

- 1. Creates new Code Sec. 120.216 providing for a 2021 Limited Retirement Option
- Age 55 with 10 years of credited service (reduced from age 55 with 20 years)
- Age 60 with 5 years of credited service (reduced from age 65 with 5 years)
- Any age with 20 years of credited service, but less than 30 years of credited service, with a reduced accrual rate of 2% (reduced from 25 years of service at any age)
- 2. Police and Fire Pension Fund, Correctional Officer Retirement Plan, and JEA employees are not eligible for this early retirement window
- 3. Establishes a six month early retirement window from 4/1/21 9/30/21
- 4. Requires written or electronic notice of the retirement election and date of retirement to the Board between 4/1/21 5/31/21
- 5. Employees retiring under this option may not come back under full time employment with the City for one year and may not rejoin the DB plan if ever re-employed by the City
- 6. Allows employees eligible to retire under this option to convert to the Defined Contribution (DC) plan at the actuarial present value of their DB pension
- 7. Provides for an exception to Code Sec. 106.108(c) which requires the affected pension plan to be at least 90% actuarially funded at the time of approval of legislation affecting pension benefits (approval of this exception requires 2/3 vote of Council)

Financial Impact/Discussion Points:

- 1. Based on the October 1, 2019 actuarial valuation, there are 491 participants eligible for early retirement under the proposed options
- 2. The actuarial impact statement shows an increase in the Unfunded Actuarial Accrued Liability (UAAL):
- \$28,740,961 based on 100% take rate
- \$14,370,481 based on 50% take rate
- \$7,185,240 based on 25% take rate
- 3. The actuarial impact statement shows an increase in the annual Employer Contribution:
- \$648,913 based on a 100% take rate
- \$324,457 based on a 50% take rate
- \$162,228 based on a 25% take rate
- 4. The legislation does not reduce the authorized employee cap. The City would incur an increase in the employer contribution to the DC plan (12%) should the positions be filled. If the positions are filled, the employer's DC contribution would increase by:
- \$2,847,574 based on a 100% take rate
- \$1,423,787 based on a 50% take rate
- \$711,894 based on a 25% take rate
- 5. The total financial impact of bullets #3 and #4 above is equal to:
- \$3,496,487 based on a 100% take rate
- \$1,748,244 based on a 50% take rate
- \$874,122 based on a 25% take rate
