Presentation: Department of Health - Dr. Pauline Rolle - Covid-19 Update

Dr. Pauline Rolle gave an update on COVID-19. The number of positive cases has been below 200 cases a day and the positivity rate has been relatively low. In terms of the vaccine, 73% of the 65-year-old and up residents have been vaccinated. CM Pittman asked for the city versus state statistics of vaccines provided. Dr. Rolle said she does not have those numbers but detailed that 249,000 people have been vaccinated and 148,000 have completed the 2-vaccine regiment. CM Becton asked where the Johnson & Johnson vaccine will be located. Dr. Rolle said it will be available at the Gateway and Regency locations. CM Freeman asked if there was data in terms of communities that have not had access to the vaccine. Dr. Rolle said the biggest hurdles have been people waiting on herd immunity and those that are skeptical of vaccines.

CM Bowman suggested deferral of the legislation so there could be more time to discuss the funding, CM Becton talked about how needed the funding for sidewalks is in Jacksonville and how these kinds of improvements would be valuable to the communities. CM Becton suggested deferral of the bill and said that there are many projects city wide that could use these funds. CM Boylan also said he supported deferral. The Public Service Grant Council Chair Bob Baldwin talked about the work that they do and how this funding will allow for many important groups to receive much needed funding. CM Carlucci said this funding will help the vulnerable population that is left out when PSG is unable to fund programs.

John Pappas, Director of Public Works, talked about the projects that are on the priority lists for Public Works. CM Becton asked Mr. Pappas if \$500,000 would be beneficial for immediate repairs of sidewalks. CM Carrico suggested an amendment which would bifurcate the funding between Public Service Grants Council and city sidewalk funding. The amendment split the funding equally between the two uses. John Pappas said he has a long list of sidewalk needs to which additional funding could be applied. Paige Johnston, Office of General Counsel, explained that a whereas clause will be added to the bill to reflect the Public Works provision and there will have to be a CIP amendment to reflect the sidewalk repairs. Peggy Sidman, Office of General Counsel, clarified that since the bill will now have a mid-year CIP amendment it will need to be passed by the full city council with a 2/3rd majority.
