Northeast Florida Regional Council Presentation

Beth Payne, CEO of the Northeast Florida Regional Council, made a presentation on the work of the Council, which has a 30-member board of directors including CMs DeFoor and Freeman, and13 staff members. The Council operates the Health Care Coalition, which provides disaster preparedness services for the area's health care industry. Regional disaster preparedness training and exercises is one of NEFRC's primary functions, along with being the transportation disadvantaged planning agency for a 7 county region. The Council is also heavily involved in regional resiliency planning and collaboration for the 7 counties. Resiliency is being increasingly funded by the state and federal governments. The Council also provides regional economic development support, including providing REMI economic impact modeling for economic development projects. They are also the town planner for several small towns in the region. NEFRC just produced an economic resilience recovery plan for the COVID post-pandemic period. The Council is available to assist and facilitate, not to dictate to its member governments. CMs Carlucci and DeFoor thanked Ms. Payne for the excellent support provided to the Special Committee on Resiliency which helped to produce a great outcome.

Council Auditor Kim Taylor described the reason for taking up the Property Appraiser's budget before the normal budget process in order to meet the deadline for submitting the office's budget to the Florida Department of Revenue in June. Ms. Taylor reviewed some of the details of the budget, noting that some line items remain to be filled in later by the Budget Office for non-discretionary expenses. Property Appraiser Jerry Holland said he will bring 2 requests for enhancements during the budget process in August. One is for doing aerial photography annually rather than every 3 years (which is useful for many City departments), another is a 2.5% salary increase for employees, depending on what the administration negotiates with the City's union employees. He reported that the Property Appraiser's Office will continue work on homestead exemption fraud; \$6M in liens for past-due taxes has been levied, plus \$57M in additional taxable value has been added to the tax rolls. They will start doing more audits on tangible personal property next, which is likely under-reported because it is self-reported. Early audits show that there is revenue to be had as that work goes on.

CM Salem asked about the position being eliminated. Mr. Holland said that new software is saving labor. CM Priestly Jackson asked about who uses the aerial photos. Mr. Holland said the Public Works Department contributed funding toward the contract last year, and the Sheriff's Office and Jacksonville Aviation Authority are considering contributing funding as well. The photography is free and available to the public on the City's web site. Ms. Priestly Jackson recommends that the Property Appraiser's web site notate that the information is public and may be used by anyone; most citizens will be unaware that detailed aerial photography of their property is publicly available and may have privacy concerns. CM Morgan thanked Mr. Holland for the good work of his staff on the Value Adjustment Board. CM DeFoor asked about the volume of work in his office as the COVID pandemic begins to wane. Mr. Holland said the housing market is going crazy and prices are rising substantially, which will impact the City's revenue budget next year, not this year.

CM Becton explained the request for the emergency so that this bill can be heard alongside 2021-223 (the local option gas tax expansion bill) and be a viable alternative to raising taxes. He committed in the TEU Committee yesterday that he will ask for this bill to be postponed if 2021-223 doesn't come out of the Committee of the Whole tomorrow – he wants them to be considered simultaneously. CM Cumber supported the emergency to provide an alternative to raising the local option gas tax. The committee members discussed the timing of consideration of the two bills – 2021-289 would be on the agenda of the May 25th regular council meeting if moved as an emergency; the LOGT bill is on the agenda for the Committee of the Whole on 26th. Mr. Becton reiterated that he will ask for this bill to be placed on the agenda for tomorrow's Committee of the Whole but the Council President declined to do that. CM alem said he is supportive of this bill under the circumstances described by Mr. Becton – this proposal is an alternative to the LOGT if it should fail and this bill would be withdrawn if the LOGT bill passes.

In response to a question from Council Member Priestly Jackson, Mr. Peterson said the City could issue \$860M in debt without violating its 5 debt management ratios, although the \$860M includes any debt the School Board may choose to issue. Ms. Priestly Jackson asked if there is borrowing capacity for both the CM Becton bill and the CM Hazouri bill to provide \$100M for septic tank remediation; Mr. Peterson said there is. CM Cumber said that illustrates that the City has borrowing capacity for infrastructure separate from the LOGT increase. CM Dennis opposed the emergency motion and borrowing more money that will burden the taxpayers with additional debt service, and opposed tying the Becton bill to the LOGT bill. CM Carlucci advocated for increasing investment in the city's infrastructure needs. CM Priestly Jackson opposed the motion for the emergency. CM Cumber advocated for the emergency and said that should the emergency not be approved in Finance, she would agree with Mr. Becton proposing his bill as an amendment to the LOGT bill in tomorrow's Committee of the Whole. CM Morgan said she would support the emergency for purposes of discussing the bill, but would vote against the bill.

CM Becton said approving this bill doesn't automatically mean that funds will be immediately borrowed and debt service start accruing. Given current conditions, it will likely take a long time to get projects started and completed. This bill is intended as a signal that infrastructure improvements are a high priority. CM Cumber asked Public Works Director John Pappas about how quickly infrastructure money can be spent and what the current construction market is like. Mr. Pappas said roadway resurfacing and sidewalk projects work can be done quickly because they don't need right-of-way acquisition; other projects take more time for ROW and design. Ms. Cumber asked if there is an average time frame for completing major road projects. Mr. Pappas said he couldn't give an average because projects vary so widely – a lot depends on ROW and stormwater pond availability. CM DeFoor asked if the constraint is a money issue, a project capacity issue or both. Mr. Pappas said it depends on the project, but the department does not have the capacity to spend \$100M in a year even on easier projects.

CM Dennis offered an amendment to make New Town drainage the top priority for funding should this bill pass –

CM Cumber opposed the amendment and urged letting the normal prioritization process work. CM Priestly Jackson said not all neighborhoods have been funded and treated equitably over the years and council members have the right to advocate for the needs of their district; she supports the amendment. CM Carlucci opposed the amendment.

CM Dennis offered an amendment to his amendment to allocate \$10M of the \$100M of new authorized funding to a New Town drainage project – the motion failed.

CM Becton said his bill doesn't mandate borrowing – there are lots of other potential funding sources, including pay-as-you-go and federal American Recovery Act funding. CM Priestly Jackson said the bill title clearly authorizes borrowing and usually that's what happens when borrowing is authorized.

CM Dennis offered amendment to the Becton bill requiring that City Council must approve before any borrowing takes place – died for lack of a second

The motion to approve 2021-289 failed 3-4. CM Becton thanked the committee for moving the emergency and engaging in good debate.

Phillip Peterson explained the request for the emergency. CM Cumber asked Joey Greive to discuss the length of the grant period and if FDLE would consider an extension. Mr. Greive said FDLE has been very accommodating about maximizing the City's ability to use the grant short of authorizing a grant extension. In response to a question from CM DeFoor, Mr. Greive said the City would not be expending any funds that would not be reimbursed by the grant. CM Salem asked how much City funding has gone into the program and what metrics are being collected to evaluate the success rate of Cure Violence. Mr. Greive said that the City is funding \$1.6-1.7M for the first two project sites, and will be proposing additional funding for a third site in the upcoming budget. They will be collecting data for reporting to Council.

Council Auditor Report

Council Auditor Kim Taylor reported on Report #847 – Independent Agency Quarterly Budget Summary for the 6 Months Ended March 31, 2021. She noted that her office has still not received the City's second quarter budget report yet due to issues with the implementation of the 1Cloud financial management system and the effort to close fiscal year 2019-20. None of the authorities indicate any budgetary stress after two fiscal quarters. JAA has received \$25.8M in federal CARES Act funding and JTA has been awarded \$76.3M. JEA is allowed to use fund balance to without further City Council approval to pay down debt, which they did in the amount of \$106.8M.
