There was a lengthy discussion regarding this bill. CM Priestly Jackson spoke in opposition, since there are areas of need throughout the city and because the residents who have unfulfilled promises from consolidation have dispersed to other parts of Jacksonville.

CM Boylan appreciated the spirit of the bill and the lower target percentage.

CM DeFoor spoke about the infrastructure needs in the pre-consolidated boundary area.

CM Newby liked the lower target percentage also, but mentioned that he wished more of Districts 8 and 10 were included.

CM Dennis talked about the big projects listed in the CIP budget- stadium improvements, McCoys Creek- and how funds do not necessarily flow to the actual neighborhood projects that need it. CM Dennis suggested deferral to workshop the bill.

CM Pittman commended CM Carlucci for his intent with this bill, and mentioned the impact of the upcoming redistricting.

CM Priestly Jackson said that since people don't live downtown anymore (de-densification), the funding should follow to where the socio-disadvantaged/vulnerable residents live regardless of district - tracked by location of Title 1 schools.

CM Carlucci talked about how this bill is a good start to address the pre-consolidation area needs, and that how it is about time to meet those needs. Jordan Elsbury, Chief of Staff- Mayor's Office, said that the bill does not impact any current CIP projects, explained how the administration prioritizes neighborhood needs, and said that the legislation addresses specific infrastructure categories.

CM Priestly Jackson said that the map used excludes residents in need, particularly in D 10.

CM Priestly Jackson said the optics of a moratorium are questionable, wherein the public may view it as a way to shirk controversial name changes.
