## AMEND(FINANCE)/APPROVE

CM Pittman explained the work conducted by the JSEB Special Committee, which was formed to identify any successes and challenges that the JSEB program may have. There was discussion of contracting an updated disparity study to assess program weaknesses, and to replace the stale data from the 2012 study.

CM Dennis talked about his own JSEB experience as a business owner, and mentioned hurtful rumors about an ethical conflict due to his company having City contracts when he was elected in 2015. CM Dennis said that the state Ethics Commission issued an assessment at the time that indicted there were no conflicts and the document is available to the public. CM Dennis also said that he may have additional amendments to this bill to add at the full council meeting next week.

Joey Grieve, CFO, spoke about the JSEB Access to Capital Program Trust Fund as a mechanism to take in donations, and the 51 percent percentage of

ownership which should be flexible for businesses owned by multiple partners. CM Dennis asked about JSEB participants who may own multiple businesses. Greg Pease, Chief of Procurement, said that those cases are evaluated individually.

- This bill authorizes the issuance of debt for the purchase of the three parking garages commonly referred to as the Sports Complex, Arena, and Courthouse garages from Metropolitan Parking Solutions (MPS).
- The purchase price consists of a return of equity of \$3 million to MPS and paying off bonds totaling \$29,905,000.
- Per the Treasury Division, based on current market conditions, the City could issue debt and realize a NPV savings of \$4.9 million over the life (approximately 10 years) of the outstanding bonds.
- Under the current agreement:
- Any cash shortfall in operating expenses, bond payments or MPS' guaranteed return from parking garage revenue is funded by the City in the form of a development loan.
- The City contributes (via the Northbank Downtown CRA) approximately \$4 million annually to MPS in the form of development loans.
- Based on the current contract the City is required to continue to make the annual contribution for approximately 10 more years until the bonds issued by MPS are paid off.
- The current cumulative amount of development loans plus interest is more than \$70 million and continues to grow annually. The City does not anticipate receiving payment of the development loans as reflected in the City's audited financials.
- The current non-default cash purchase price would be an estimated \$50 \$55 million plus the forgiveness of the loans.
