1. Approval - Jacksonville Waterways Commission Minutes for September 9, 2020.

Minutes from the Jacksonville Waterways Commission Meeting were approved from September 9th, 2020.

2. St. Johns River Status Report on Water Quality and Manatees - Dr. White & Dr. Pinto

Dr. White said this has been a record hurricane season. With 16 straight days of rain, Jacksonville is 2 inches above normal in rainfall (51 inches). Water temperatures are still quite warm. Dr. White talked about the huge shifts in salinity. Dr. White said they are working on a boater compliance study which will be brought up later in the meeting in terms of the manatee protection study. Mr. Pringle asked about the salinity. Dr. White said that salt water is denser than fresh water, slightly fresher on the top of the water and with more salt water on the bottom. CM Bowman asked what we can do about speed zones. Dr. White said clearer signs are important and that it is a state and federal process which he has continued to push for more.

Dr. Pinto said that there are no more manatee deaths to report with 8 overall for the year.

James Richardson, EPB, talked about the State of the River Report. October 22nd will be the official release of the State of the River Report.

CM Dennis explained the bill which will exercise the local option vessel registration fee. These fees will be able to be used to help update and maintain the docks. Paige Johnston, OGC, explained that the Tax Collector's Office receives the boater registration fees, so these fees would be put into a trust fund that would have to be approved by the City Council and there would be an annual report to the Waterways Commission in regards to spending. CM Bowman asked about the City Council's role in spending these fees and the functionality. CM Dennis said the fees will go towards funding the Administration's program to rehab docks in Jacksonville. Mr. Adkison said this was looked into previously by Lori Boyer when she was a Council Member and the key is to make sure the money is going into the FIND fund. Susan Grandin, OGC, explained that these funds do go through a process. Mr. Hardesty asked if the funds could go through the Waterways Commission. Paige Johnston explained that the funds would have to go through the City Council for approval, but could also go to Waterways for their recommendation. Ms. Johnston explained the optional fee which would be an additional fee. Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office, said that the City would net approximately \$250,000 to \$300,000 based on registered boaters in 2019. Brian Burket, Parks Department, said that these funds would go towards the efforts of maintenance and updates for docks. Ms. Grandin said these funds could be used for patrol, regulation and maintenance for boating related activities in Duval County. Ms. Grandin said it could go to patrol or regulation of derelict vessels. Mr. Devereaux detailed how these funds could possibly be used for derelict vessels or floating structures since they have caused damage to docks. Mr. Devereaux, said that if they added "including but not limited to the safety of the boating public", so it could possibly be used for derelict vessels or floating structures. Paige Johnston wanted to make it clear about the annual registration and the optional fee. Ms. Johnston said that the annual fee could go towards the

derelict vessels and floating structures, while the optional fees could not go to the derelict vessels and floating structures. Mr. Deveraux said he would reach out to get an opinion on this issue from the State Attorney General. Ms. Johnston explained the timeline of the bill and when it could go into effect. CM Bowman suggested a special meeting to talk about this bill and said that a public meeting might be helpful. CM Dennis said he could schedule a public meeting for next week. The bill was deferred.

Ed Lukacovic, Planning and Development, went over the land use amendment through a PowerPoint slide. He detailed the timeline for the amendment. Mr. Lukacovic explained that the green section in the handout was to be set aside for conservation. Mr. Devereaux asked if there was a reason why three years ago this didn't move forward. CM Ferraro said that the area highlighted for conservation was not set aside in the previous application. The area set aside now is 3.96 acres for wetlands.

CM Morgan talked about the amazing work that is being done at Jacksonville University. This will complete a four year study to look into the effects mercury can have in the water system. Mr. Richardson said that this bill will just be asking for an extension to assess the levels of mercury in water, air, sediments, and fish. CM Bowman asked to be added as a co-sponsor. Mr. Pringle asked about the levels of mercury. Mr. Richardson said it is currently present in the water system and the level will depend on where in the system you look for mercury. Mr. Adkison talked about oyster harvesting and where they are looking to reopen these spaces after cleaning up the river. Phillip Peterson, Council Auditor's Office, clarified that the \$6,700 is in addition to the original contract. Mr. Richardson said this study was not a state mandated study and is based on the request of the board. CM Ferraro asked to be added as a co-sponsor.

Discussion on Storm Water Discharge into the St. John's River

John Pappas, Public Works, talked about updating areas with new systems for storm water management. He said that fitting baffle boxes or storm receptors can be difficult. He talked about the application of the filters. CM Ferraro said he is working to help communities that are dealing with construction and issues with storm water discharge. Mr. Pappas talked about erosion and sediment controls and the importance of maintaining this until after the construction is finished.

Discuss a Creation of a No Wake Zone/Slow Speed Zones Committee

Ms. Haskell talked about issues regarding technicalities that they must meet. She suggested forming a committee in regards to no wake zone and slow speed zones. She said she would lead the committee. Mr. Birtalan, Mr. Adkison, Mr. Burnett and CM Bowman said they would be a part of the committee. Captain Suber said to just call the committee, the Wake Zone Committee. Dr. White offered to be a resource to the Committee.

Discuss Flood Concerns on Hood Road Boat Ramp - Jill Enz

Ms. Enz went over a PowerPoint which showed the Hood Landing Boat Ramp renovations. The total cost of the renovation was \$69,298. CM Ferraro asked about flooding in the area. Ms. Enz said it depends on if it is high tide.

#### Sandbar Created, Possibly as a Result of River Dredging - Eric Green

James Bennett, Jaxport, talked about the tour along Blount Island and the use of drone flights to get visuals of the areas of concern. They could not get enough information from the drone flights to understand water depths. Jaxport will try again this Friday to get visuals of the locations and sandbar. CM Ferraro asked if one of these three members could go along on their tour: Mr. Devereaux, Mr. Adkison or Mr. Hardesty. Mr. Bennett clarified that these drones are solo. Mr. Harrah, USACE, said they had already done a boat ride with Mr. Hardesty where they clarified the location of the shoal.

Update on Dredge Spoil Removal From Disposal Sites - Mark Crosley

Mr. Crosley, FIND Office, talked about spoil sites - Jacksonville has 6 sites.

Updates on Shad Creek - CM Ferraro

CM Ferraro said there will be a meeting with the Administration, CM Ferraro and the community to look at the waterways and wake zones in the area. This would be a follow up to a previous meeting where the community highlighted the areas of concern.

FIND Subcommittee - CM Ferraro

Mr. Devereaux said they are continuing to look for funding sources.
