2. St. Johns River Status Report on Water Quality and Manatees - Dr. White & Dr. Pinto

Dr. White said that the water temperature is warming up which is good for manatees and the water levels are high. There have been no reports of algae blooms and no red tide in the area. Dr. White talked about the dam that was breaching in Tampa and talked about how that situation has been handled. Dr. White said there will be a big problem this summer in that area due to all the nutrients that have dumped in the area. Dr. White talked about a barge which was carrying coal ash from Puerto Rico that is still currently stuck out in the water due to a sandbar. The coal ash aboard was ultimately headed to a landfill in Southeast Georgia. Dr. White talked about the potential environmental impacts.

Dr. Pinto said that there have been 11 manatee deaths this year and none of these deaths were from vehicles.

9. Contact: Mari Kuraishi - Waterfront Public Spaces @ 9:45am (10 Minutes)

Mari Kuraishi, President of Jessie Ball duPont Fund, talked about how public input can be used for waterfront development. Mr. Pringle said he would like to help give his input to make sure waterfront public spaces are made accessible. Ms. Kuraishi said they are working with city partners to make sure the private and public partnerships are made positive for the community and enhance the waterfront experience.

10. Contact: Lori Boyer - DIA Plans for Downtown Presentation (30 Minutes)

Lori Boyer, DIA CEO, went over a PowerPoint presentation for the plans for Downtown and riverwalk connectivity. The presentation went over the existing riverwalk and the planned extensions. The presentation covered the Emerald Trail master plan as well as the riverwalk connection and extension which bring together downtown walkability. Ms. Boyer showed the cultural institutions in the area and how this development will make them more accessible. Ms. Boyer highlighted the current and planned kayak launches in the downtown area. Mr. Pringle asked about wheelchair accessibility to the landing area. Ms. Boyer said that all of the riverwalk projects will be fully accessible and they plan to explore opportunities to build more restaurants along the water. Adam Hoyles said he was very excited about the projects and asked what in the plans respond to the resiliency issues. Ms. Boyer said that there are three sides to resiliency and flood protection, water quality and the importance of making any new development resilient, and the impact of the development on surrounding developments.

11. Contact: Lindsey Brock - Artificial Reefs in Northeast Florida Committee Update

Mr. Brock talked about the first meeting the committee had and the differences in reefs and their impact on the water. Mr. Brock said artificial reefs will be more beneficial at the mouth of the river. Mr. Brock said it will be important to work with the fishing community for their opinions on the benefits. Dr. White showed a video that covered the artificial reef program in Jacksonville.

12. Contact: Jill Haskell - Wake Zone Committee Update

Jill Haskell gave an update from the recent Wake Zone Committee. The committee looked at the possible implementation of safety zones in Clapboard Creek. The committee looked into wake zone signage in Ortega River, but there was significant citizen resistance to wake zone signs. The committee does agree that safety zone signs are needed for the Fort George area.

13. Contact: Kara Tucker & Jill Enz - ADA Waterways

Kara Tucker, Chief of Disabled Services, gave an overview of accessible fishing docks and future plans to make spaces more accessible. Mr. Pringle talked about the importance of having accessible fishing docks and public spaces. Chair Ferraro suggested that a representative from Disabled Services attend future Waterways Commission meetings.

14. Contact: Susan Grandin - Fisherman's Marina Enforcement Update

Susan Grandin, Office of General Counsel, gave an update on the enforcement at Fisherman's Marina. DEP has received a letter from the Fisherman's Marina's agent regarding the schedule of the vessel removal. JSO has been working on the uplands area and this will be a coordinated effort.

## 15. Public Comment

Stanley Scott said he is concerned about ADA accessibility for docks.

John Nooney read the public comments from the previous Waterways meeting and talked about the Beach Boulevard boat ramp.

Andrew Tully voiced his concerns about wake zone signage.
