Anne Coglianese, Chief Resiliency Officer, gave a PowerPoint presentation covering the work her office has been doing and the grants which have been obtained. The presentation covered the office's complete vulnerability assessment and comprehensive resilience strategy. CM DeFoor and CM Carlucci congratulated Ms. Coglianese on her ability to obtain grants totaling \$21.3 million. CM Ferraro asked if she takes positions on environmental issues. Ms. Coglianese said she is more focused on systemic solutions and her office is looking at climate impacts over a 50 year time frame.
