Council Auditor Presentation - Report #854: Independent Agency Quarterly Summary for the Twelve Months Ended September 30, 2021

Council Auditor Kim Taylor reviewed Report #854 - Independent Agency Quarterly Summary for the Twelve Months Ended September 30, 2021. She noted that the Auditor's Office has not yet received the City's quarterly summary, so no quarterly summaries of the City budget were produced for FY20-21 but a year-end report is expected shortly after the annual financial audit was completed in December. JEA has ended its fuel stabilization reserve process so the fuel charge on customer bills will vary on a monthly basis as the price of fuel for electricity generation rises and falls. JTA is experiencing no budgetary stress and will need to file a budget amendment to true-up spending in several categories that exceeded budget authorizations for FY20-21. The Council recently approved similar amendments for the two previous fiscal years. JPA is experiencing no budgetary stress and ended the year with a \$28.8M surplus for the year. JAA is experiencing no budgetary stress and ended the year with a \$28.8M surplus.

Emergency Rental Assistance Program Update

Deputy CAO Stephanie Burch said the ERAP 1 program is closed and final accounting may change the final figures only slightly. All activity is now taking place in ERAP 2. Number of households assisted with rent to date – 5,980. Amount paid for rental assistance to date - \$36,027,875. Number of households assisted with utilities – 2,456. Amount paid for utility assistance to date - \$1,679,453. Amount paid for mortgage assistance to date - \$2,937,916. Funds still available – \$15,600,000.

As requested at the last meeting, Ms. Burch reported that there were 13,525 non-completed applications for ERAP assistance. When applications are started but non-responsive for 30 days the City makes at least 3 attempts to contact the applicant to complete the application process. In addition to the 13,525 non-completed applications, 6,303 were denied for various reasons – duplicate applications, potential fraud, exceeded income limitation, no past-due rent/utilities, no COVID financial impact, etc. In response to a question from Council Member Pittman about whether applicants identified as submitting potentially fraudulent applications could reapply for assistance, Ms. Burch said they could and those applications will be carefully examined as other applications are.

Financial Report Update

CFO Joey Greive reported that the City sent the FY19-20 annual financial report to the Joint Legislative Auditing Committee in Tallahassee on December 31st as promised. His department is now working on closing out FY20-21 now and will have a quarterly report for the fourth quarter to Council in the near future.

Mr. Greive reported that the General Fund unallocated reserve is up from \$187M in FY20 to \$210M in FY21. COVID case counts and testing needs are increasing and the administration will be filing a bill tomorrow to allocate more General Fund resources to those needs in advance of getting additional federal funding. Kim Taylor said the Government Finance Officers Association recommends holding a minimum reserve equal to 2 months of expenses and the Ordinance Code has established a target for the Operating Reserve of equal to 5% of the operating budget. The City's various reserves are very healthy.

Phillip Peterson explained the amendment. CMs Gaffney, Pittman, Salem and Freeman asked to be added as co-sponsors. CM Pittman asked about maintenance of the equipment; Mr. Peterson said the agreement makes EWU responsible for maintenance. Chairman Salem noted that no fees are to be charged for use of the facility for 5 years; any fee imposed thereafter must be approved by the City. President Newby advocated for the bill because of the lack of health and fitness resources in that area of the city. Infant mortality is disturbingly high in that area as well.

Randolph Mitchell of EWU described the university's commitment to supporting the surrounding community in the areas of health and wellness promotion, food distribution, education, etc.

CM Carlucci expressed support for EWU but had reservations about allocating funds intended for Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) grant match to non-waterway purposes. He will be exploring options for how to preserve funds for waterway needs. Mr. Greive explained the use of the FIND grant General Fund grant match reserves for other purposes when one of the City's five FIND applications was not approved by the district. That project is expected to be resubmitted to FIND and hopefully funded in the next budget cycle. CM Boylan recommended the EWU contact Angela Strain at Jax Care Connect to help leverage their efforts to improve community health by connecting existing efforts already underway. He also suggested that EWU might submit a Public Service Grant application to help pay future costs of the fitness center as a community health initiative. CM Pittman noted that the new center will be located in the former James Weldon Johnson School on the EWU campus which, along with the Schell-Sweet Center, will make EWU a one-stop-shop for health and wellness in the New Town area. CM Carlucci again advocated for always having funding ready and waiting for waterways-related matching grant opportunities, particularly with the creation of the position of Chief Resiliency Officer which will likely generate additional grant applications.

The bill was deferred. CM Carlucci explained his rationale for filing the bill and said he is still working on some details, including a minimum floor for PSG funding to return it to a level equivalent to the City's commitment to the program in the early 2000s. Many agencies with very commendable programs score highly on their PSG applications, but there is insufficient funding to meet all the needs. CM Boylan advocated for a noticed council member meeting to discuss the details and said that there is insufficient awareness of the value of these non-profits and the great work they do.
