Rules Committee Redistricting Matters and Public Hearings Updates

Chair Priestly Jackson recapped the events from the first redistricting public hearing, held on January 27th. She said that the questions asked during public comment from that meeting would be addressed by the relevant subject matter experts at the February 3rd meeting. The list of questions was distributed to the committee members. Paige Johnston shared an OGC memo on quorum for the redistricting public hearings. The memo said that although the hearings do not require the Rules Committee to take action/vote, attendance is in keeping with the committee duties as defined in the Ordinance Code. Ms. Johnston said that quorum is essential to the process of gaining input from the public, and to maintain accountability and integrity by being present to listen.
