Chairman Bowman convened the meeting and the attendees introduced themselves for the record. The Chairman announced that the committee would recess briefly at 11:00 a.m. for a major announcement event in the atrium with the University of Florida's new president. He reviewed the order of business for the meeting, noting that the previously scheduled JEA briefing will not take place as scheduled today, but will be replaced by a brief overview of a proposed early closeout of the Better Jacksonville Plan. Mr. Bowman noted that the council member submissions for the Council Strategic Plan significantly exceed the amount of money available and asked council members to consider requesting voluntary reductions. Ordinances 2023-22 and 2023-23 will be taken up prior to 2023-18 because they are related bills.

# Better Jacksonville Plan early sunset presentation

CFO Joey Greive gave an overview of the Better Jacksonville Plan projects and the early sunset proposal which would allow the half-cent BJP sales tax to be shifted to pension liability funding several years earlier than currently required. The proposed bill will meet the promise of spending no more than \$1.5 billion on the BJP project list by shifting some remaining projects to City CIP funding to ensure that they are all completed as promised. Paying off the BJP bonds early will allow the sales tax to shift to pension liability funding several years early which will encourage the national bond rating agencies to raise the City's rating and thereby reduce the cost of future borrowing.

CM Salem recalled the skepticism in some parts of the community in 2000 when the BJP referendum was being promoted that the sales tax would never end and would collect more than the \$1.5 billion promised cap. The tax is being extended but only because of voter approval of the pension reform referendum and extension of the sales tax. CM Carlucci asked about the status of the rapid transit right-of-way acquisition project included in the BJP. Council Auditor Kim Taylor said that element was moved from a City project to a JTA project and is not now part of the BJP project list. It remains for JTA to complete with other revenues and is not incorporated in the \$1.5 billion overall BJP cap.

# **Council Auditor Presentation**

Council Auditor Kim Taylor presented the results of 1 recently released report:

Report #780B - Follow-up on Jacksonville Sheriff's Office Payroll Audit: the 16 remaining issues after the first follow-up report have all been completed and the audit is now considered closed. A new JSO timekeeping system has been implemented so any future audit of that function would be a new audit and not a follow-up to this report.

# **City Council Strategic Plan Process**

Chairman Bowman said that 14 of 19 council members had submitted proposals by the deadline for items that should benefit the entire city. \$7.7 million will be requested from the General Fund budget to provide for Strategic Plan funding pursuant to the Council's recent ordinance. The Chair noted that the requests exceed that amount and asked that members who submitted proposals to please consider possible funding reductions to get down to the \$7.7 million for discussion of the proposals at the next Finance Committee meeting. CM Carrico said he would reduce his "traffic calming for safer neighborhoods" request by half to \$50,000 per district and would eliminate the allocations to at-large council members. CM Carlucci expressed reservations about allocating equal funding to all council districts because the needs vary so much from district to district.

CM Newby said he would reduce his "access to health care" proposal by half to \$750,000. Paul Sapia of Humana and Jennifer Ryan with Volunteers in Medicine briefly advocated for Mr. Newby's proposal because of the tremendous need for expanded citizen knowledge of the health care resources already available in the community. CM Clark-Murray advocated for her "outfall study" proposal because of the damage being done to private properties by erosion of drainage ditches. She will consult with Public Works Director Steve Long to firm up a cost for the needed study. Chairman Bowman said the intention of the strategic plan projects is to deal with citywide issues and not be strictly district-specific. CM Boylan said he would be calling a noticed meeting with Council President Freeman about how their rental assistance, affordable housing and homelessness reduction proposals relate to each other and to arrive at a dollar amount. He does not have specific numbers for his several proposals yet but will refine them in the future. Jim Kowalski of Jacksonville Area Legal Aid said that Jacksonville has a serious problem with mortgage foreclosures and rental evictions. They know what works in the foreclosure arena and want to expand that knowledge to greater efforts in the rental sphere. CM Boylan said he will be developing legislation regarding a City commitment to solving the affordable housing crisis.

CM Morgan said Jacksonville needs to change the community's mindset about littering behavior and her proposal to "clean up Jacksonville/litter control" is aimed at that rather than simply collecting litter. Tom Hudson of the Solid Waste Division said that manpower for litter cleanups has decreased over the years and that there is only \$250,000 in funding for that function annually. CM Salem said President Freeman had 3 proposals regarding quality of life issues and he hoped that they will be priorities of the council. CM Pittman said that initial efforts to "revitalize neighborhood commercial corridors" have seen success and that pilot program needs to be expanded, particularly in urban core neighborhoods. CM Carlucci described his proposal for "protecting and revitalizing historical buildings outside of the downtown area", which already has its own dedicated funding source. He offered to reduce his funding request to \$500,000. Dr. Alan Bliss, CEO of the Jacksonville Historical Society, advocated for protection and promotion of the community's historic identity and said that historic preservation projects create skilled jobs and stimulate economic development. Terrance Brisbane of Beaver Street Enterprise Center advocated for CM Gaffney's "small business assistance program". CM White advocated for providing automated external defibrillators to all parks operated by athletic associations.

Phillip Peterson explained the amendment. CM Boylan described the rate review process for Waste Pro and the negotiations between the City and the hauler over the new rate. He said that Waste Pro is interested in continuing to serve Jacksonville via a contract extension at the \$23.11 rate which would avoid an expensive RFP process. Steve Diebenow representing Waste Pro said the company can't continue to provide service at the current \$19.01 rate, having lost over \$5 million in the first quarter of this fiscal year. The \$23.11 rate for the last year of the contract until September 2023 would lead to negotiations between the parties over a 6-year extension with a rate review after 3 years and a CPI adjustment factor for Waste Pro equivalent to what is in the other haulers' contracts. CM Salem cautioned against losing another waste hauler company and being beholden to just one or two companies to serve the city. He believes that an RFP process will produce much higher costs than the negotiated \$23.11. In response to a question from CM Boylan, Mr. Diebenow said that the company intends to purchase new trucks, which is part of the reason for needing a 6-year extension in order to effectively depreciate those vehicles.
