Chairman Bowman convened the meeting and the attendees introduced themselves for the record. Mr. Bowman reviewed the agenda order. Item #15, 2023-147, will be taken up after the external audit report and the Council Auditor's report on a recent audit. The Chair said he will have a discussion on several bills about whether they can be completed before the new council takes office in July.

Presentation by Carr, Riggs and Ingram (CRI) on the City's FY 20/21 year-end audit

April Shuping of Carr, Riggs and Ingram (CRI), the City's independent auditor, reviewed the City's FY20-21 financial audit. The City received a clean opinion on the audit report, meaning the financial data supplied was materially correct with no revisions. CRI's internal control findings (p. 252) offer areas for improvement. Items 1-3 are tied to 1Cloud implementation and the difficulties encountered in that process. In its Required Communications section, CRI found that its FY20 findings regarding the challenges with 1Cloud are largely repeated in the FY21 audit concerning how some of the modules have been implemented and how they communicate with each other. There have been delays and challenges in getting the numbers correct. The remaining items largely relate to grant controls and compliance; the audit found no non-compliance but did identify areas where grants could be better managed to address problems with distributed management in multiple agencies. Sub-recipient relationships also need better monitoring. At Mr. Bowman's request Ms. Shuping described the audit process and timeframe, which took approximately 4,000 hours over the course of a full year. The last 2 years the audit was delayed by getting the numbers out of 1Cloud, and that situation is getting much better for FY22. National audit standards require auditors to do more in-depth work on areas of greater risk so that users of the financial report can be reasonably assured that the numbers are correct and the city's operations are sound.

CM Salem asked if 1Cloud is finally caught up and providing needed information on a timely basis. Ms. Shuping said they are very close to being back to normal operations (about 80% complete), and expect that it will be fully and timely operable by this time next year. There are still a few areas that are being worked on and all key areas that needed improvement are being dealt with, showing substantial improvement from the last 2 years. In response to a question from CM Carrico, Deputy CAO Charles Moreland said that the creation of a new Grants and Compliance Division with a division chief will address the concerns expressed about grants management. CM Morgan asked about the definition of "reasonable" with regard to audit work and findings. Ms. Shuping said "reasonable assurance" is a term of art in the accounting industry, with certain aspects being specifically defined by case law over previous audits.

CFO Joey Greive said the 1Cloud conversion process was a tremendous challenge both because of the size and complexity of the City government, the age and capabilities of the system being replaced, and the impact of the COVID pandemic. The City's new system will be much more effective and responsive when it is finally fully implemented (probably at about 80+% implemented at this point). The process will take several more years to fully complete and reach maximum usability. Council Auditor Kim Taylor said the biggest outstanding issue is bank reconciliations, which are getting better but are not perfect yet. The huge volume of grant funds the City has processed and distributed to third parties in the last couple of years has been a real challenge. Chairman Bowman congratulated Mr. Greive and Carr, Riggs and Ingram on a great working relationship that is very encouraging to see.

Council Auditor Presentation

Council Auditor Kim Taylor discussed Report #867: City Payroll – Leave Payouts at Separation of Employment Audit. Ms. Taylor said the audit was prompted by the discovery of an instance of an employee being overpaid for terminal leave by \$138,000 due to a keying error, recovery of which is in legal action now. The audit found that overall, terminal leave is being paid out properly but there were several of instances of both under- and over-payments due to the manual nature of the calculation process and a lack of supervisory oversight. The administration has been very cooperative and began addressing problems as soon as the audit was underway and problems were identified. Mr. Greive said the Phase 3 of the ERP (1Cloud) implementation will automate the leave payout process as part of the overall payroll system conversion and in the meantime they have implemented new procedures to double-check any transaction over \$7,500 for accuracy. In response to a question from CM Salem, Mr. Greive said a new payroll system needs to start on January 1 to cover a calendar year for tax purposes. The goal is January 1, 2025.
