# Council Auditor Kim Taylor to discuss Report #846A: Follow-up on Kids Hope Alliance Grants Audit

Council Auditor Kim Taylor said the original audit was issued in 2021 and the audit scope tested grants from a time period before the current KHA management was in office. Of the original 24 issues identified, 23 have been resolved as of this follow-up with 1 remaining. Progress has been made on the timely close-out of grants and that will be the subject of another follow-up as the one remaining item. Ms. Taylor noted that there were significant issues identified in the original audit and Mr. Weinstein, Dr. Grass and Shari Shuman took those very seriously in trying to address them.

Phillip Peterson explained the amendment. In response to a question from CM Salem, Eric Fuller of the Solid Waste Division explained the changes to the WastePro hauler contract approved by City Council several months ago and explained the proposed change in the new contract that would eliminate per premises rate reductions based on future rate reviews. Phillip Peterson stated that in the past decade when the inflation rate was extremely low, rate reviews have usually produced lowered rates. That is not the case in the current high inflation environment. In response to a question from CM Salem, he said that he recalled 3 instances in which the City Council ultimately awarded rates higher than what the rate review process recommended. He said the rate review process provides a useful service in determining the actual cost of service, but anticipates that the rate review process will be shorter in the future if the rate reduction prohibition is adopted.

Steve Diebenow representing WastePro described the debate on this bill in the Rules Committee yesterday and said the Council Auditor's proposed amendment to restore a reduction of the rate if the application of the rate review shows lower costs than the current rate was defeated unanimously by the committee. He noted that the negotiations for the contract approved several months ago debated the language changes being proposed today and that played into the rate that WastePro was willing to accept then. If the language eliminating future rate reductions is removed, then the company would prefer that the contract be put out to bid.

Chairman Bowman asked about the cumulative impact of the increase in the CPI adjustment cap from 3% to 5% on the City's subsidy to the Solid Waste Fund and about WastePro's performance. Will Williams of the Solid Waste Division said the company's performance has been very good with very few service complaints. Mr. Bowman said he anticipates that if this bill is approved as filed, Meridian Waste will seek the same language in its contract. He asked if the City could renegotiate the contract if the inflation rate drops substantially and the contract becomes seriously negative for the City. Mr. Peterson said the City appears to be locked into a 6-year agreement at the new terms, pending clarification by the General Counsel's Office.

CM Morgan said she wants to ensure that employees in City's solid waste collection operation are being paid commensurately with the rate the private haulers are paying. Going to an RFP process versus the rate review process seems to open the door to tremendous uncertainty. Will Williams said it would be unwise to utilize an RFP process that could produce a much higher rate than what is now on the table at \$23.11 per premises. CAO Brian Hughes said the rate trajectory for recent RFP processes in other Florida jurisdictions is very unfavorable to the taxpayers. The City's solid waste employees received pay increases in recent years to get their salary near the rate paid by the private haulers, and there are other advantages to City government versus private employment.

CM Carlucci asked why CM Boylan introduced the bill individually and if the administration is supportive of the proposal. Brian Hughes said they worked with CM Boylan because his district comprises much of the WastePro service area and the administration is supportive of the bill. CM Carlucci said the solid waste user fee inevitably has to be increased to meet the increasing cost of the service provided and the General Fund loan to the Solid Waste Enterprise Fund can't continue growing as it has to a cumulative \$40 million.

Phillip Peterson explained the emergency request. CM Salem commended the General Counsel attorneys working on the settlement agreement and outcome they produced. At the Chair's request, General Counsel Jason Teal described the process to close out the litigation, which requires approval by the trial court judge since the challenge was filed as a civil rights case. He noted that the plaintiffs retain the right to request the court to order that the 2026 School Board districts be contested in 2024, which the City opposes. He said it is normal in all redistricting processes for some residents to be represented by a City Council member or School Board member they did not elect for a period of several years until new elections take place.
