Chairman Bowman announced that this would be his last Finance Committee meeting as he will be out of the country for the final committee meeting of the Council year. Vice-Chair White will chair that meeting.

Council Auditor Presentations

• General Fund/GSD Recapture for Fiscal Year 2021/22: \$6.4 million is being recaptured from 6 funds. The Solid Waste Disposal Fund recaptured \$3.5M instead of the \$7.7M originally projected, which reduces the amount of the General Fund loan to the Solid Waste Fund. Any negative cash balance funds must be reported and there are 4 with a total negative balance of approximately \$6.4M. The administration proposes to cover those negative balances with federal ARP funds. ARP funds must be committed by 2024 and expended by 2026. CM Carlucci asked about the Solid Waste Fund loan from the General Fund. Ms. Taylor said it is approximately \$22M in 2022 and will be \$40M next year if ARP funds are not used as a funding source.

• Report #848A: Follow-up on Fleet Management Audit: all 5 remaining issues were cleared and the audit is closed.

• Report #826A: Follow-up on Metropolitan Parking Solutions (MPS) Redevelopment Agreement Audit: the audit time period preceded the mediated settlement agreement between the City and MPS reached in 2019, and the parking garage third-party operator changed in 2020, so the follow-up took a somewhat different form than usual follow-ups because so many factors had changed. The follow-up includes financial data on the garage operations going back to 2015. Since May of 2022 with DIA oversight and a new third-party operator the garages have been producing a financial surplus.

COVID-19 FEMA Reimbursement Update

CFO Joey Greive gave an update on the long process of seeking federal reimbursement for COVID-related emergency expenditures. The City has \$88M of booked costs, mostly in employee comp time costs (\$64M). FEMA is looking at huge numbers being submitted by cities and counties nationwide and therefore is issuing many denials, which is to be expected. The City expects to prevail in the appeal process. \$64M in comp time accrual has been burned down to less than \$30M (a normal level) via employees using it as leave time over the past several years. It is unlikely that there will be a huge demand for comp time use that would require a budgetary solution. Chairman Bowman asked where the FEMA refund, when eventually received, will go. Mr. Greive said it will come in unencumbered and it will be up to the next administration and council to determine how to spend. CM Salem asked if this issue will be smoothly handed off to the Deegan administration; Mr. Greive said they have been meeting with the new mayor's team and are planning for a smooth transition. Mr. Salem asked what has changed for comp time accrual in the post-COVID period. Mr. Greive said that longer-term emergencies like COVID are different than the usual hurricanes or tropical storms that required overtime for a few days, so there was no real guidance on what to do. The decision was made to book the hours as they were earned and then figure out later how to deal with funding them. Now FEMA has issued more guidance and there's a better understanding of what to do. New policies will be discussed in the next round of collective bargaining with the unions. Chairman Bowman asked about the status of the City's reserve accounts. Mr. Greive said they total close to \$300M. The City has been building reserves steadily during good fiscal times to be ready to face unforeseen emergencies in the future.

Cure Violence Presentation

Deputy CAO Charles Moreland introduced a presentation on the progress and current status of the Cure Violence program, one tool in the City's toolbox to fight violent crime. Dr. Saralyn Grass of the Grants and Contract Compliance Division gave a PowerPoint presentation covering the core strategies and logic of the program. The 3 core strategies are 1) interrupt violence transmission; 2) treat those at highest risk; and 3) change community norms. The program has 3 catchment areas around the city – Eastside (Springfield/Talleyrand area), Northside (MLK Parkway/New Kings Road area) and Westside (Herlong/Hammond/Lane Avenue area). Cure Violence provided 230 violence interruptions last year with intensive follow-up afterward. 265 clients were served last year via third-party social service and education providers. Positive reductions in violence are being recorded. Jacksonville's program results are on target when compared to other cities that have the Cure Violence initiative, showing similar patterns. Dr. Grass presented statistics from a study done in the City of Orlando on the high cost of shootings to city and county governments. The City is developing a Cure Violence newsletter.

CM Salem asked about the annual cost of the program; it is \$3.5M per year. He said the City is not measuring Cure Violence's performance against crime trends in control areas with similar demographics so he continues to be skeptical of measurements of the outcomes. Dr. Moreland said the department has recently changed its data analysis staff and will be doing a retrospective look at crime in non-CV areas to provide comparative data. Mr. Salem said the Sheriff has told him that violent crime is down citywide, so it's hard to attribute what is related to CV versus other things the Sheriff and others are doing that impact on crime trends.

CM Carrico said he's interested in the quality of the programs and the perception of their effectiveness on the streets more than the raw crime statistics. Thomas Jordan, a Cure Violence supervisor with Noah's Ark on the Northside, explained his personal experience with implementing the program on the street and directly defusing violent situations. Lamarco Wilcox said it takes a lot of compassion and personal commitment to be in dangerous situations and positively impact lives. Testimony was given about connections made across the city and personal interventions. CM Carlucci said he appreciated the personal testimony of the Cure Violence workers and encouraged continuity in the program since multiple years of experience are needed in order to develop a useful database on which to make decisions. CM Pittman said she was originally skeptical of the Cure Violence model but has come to appreciate its impact now that she has seen it in action. Chairman Bowman said he hoped that grants will be obtained to help fund the program in the future. He said it would be powerful to hear from a person whose life has been changed for the better by CV. Mr. Bowman asked about completion rates for program participants; Dr. Grass said more than 95% complete the 6-month program and many even stay connected thereafter. Dr. Moreland said the administration will provide any information the Council needs to evaluate success and make good budgetary decisions.

Assistant Council Auditor Phillip Peterson explained the amendment. CM Pittman asked if the properties are available on a first-come/first-served basis and how agencies apply. Renee Hunter of the Real Estate Division said the properties are available through the City's Housing Division and it is basically a first-come/first-served process with not-for-profit agencies getting the first opportunity to request properties before other for-profit applicants. The Community Land Trust was made the equivalent of a City agency by a previous ordinance so they get notified when City agencies are notified before the properties are made available to other agencies. Chiquita Moore of the Neighborhoods Department provided more detail on how non-City agencies are notified and make applications for available properties. She also emphasized that the process is first-come/first-served so interested organizations need to be aware of the announcement and apply as quickly as possible.
