Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the bill which authorizes a future appropriation of \$10 million to be utilized, through reimbursements, after the \$80 million from the state is depleted.

Greg Miller, UF Health, explained the project and the need for a new trauma center.

CM Cumber asked about the timeline. Mr. Miller said it would be roughly 3-4 years.

CVP Salem asked what the Administration's position is on the bill.

Dr. Moreland, Mayor's Office, said that this legislation is a council president led endeavor.

When asked about the source for the funds, Mr. Peterson said that will be determined down the road, and may be included as a budget item in 3-4 years.

CVP Salem asked why City dollars would be used as opposed to private/philanthropic funding. CMs DeFoor and Boylan concurred that it is the City's responsibility to provide funds for the new trauma center because it will be a City owned building.

CP Freeman indicated that he believed that the City obligation was a part of securing the state funds. CM Boylan asked about what other funding UF Health receives from the City. Mr. Peterson said that the City is in the fifth year of \$120 million CIP funding for capital improvements to the UF Health existing facility. Mr. Miller said that the capital improvements included much needed infrastructure repairs, like electrical upgrades, new generators, roofing, leak prevention and HVAC. Brian Hughes, Mayor's Office, explained that UF Health gets annual City funds for indigent care, and that the CIP funds to UF Health were for backlogged structural repairs that would eventually decrease operational expenses.

CM Cumber asked why it wouldn't be better to wait until after the design and engineering phase to see if the \$10 million is needed or sufficient. She also noted that the \$80 million in state funds for the trauma center were awarded last year and were not contingent upon a City contribution. Mr. Miller said that UF Health needs to know the total funding available before beginning the project. CM Ferraro asked if the project could be constructed using just the \$80 million in state funds, and Mr. Miller said no. CM Boylan asked if the contract language for the City's \$10 million could be drafted to say "up to \$10 million". Mary Staffopoulos, OGC, said that is that wording used in the contract already. CM DeFoor said that the CIP funds were needed due to past neglect, and the annual City contribution for indigent care increased recently because it had been under funded by previous administrations. She also commented on the essential nature of having a trauma center in the city, and the life-saving impact for those who need such services after car accidents or other traumatic incidents.

Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment.

Dr. Moreland, Mayor's Office, and Chiquita Moore, Director of the Neighborhoods Department, were in attendance to speak on behalf of this bill and emergency rental assistance. The appropriation was made available to the City through a reallocation of ERA2 Program grant funds by the U.S. Department of the Treasury, and will be allocated to the Social Services Division of the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department for the provision of rent and utility assistance through existing Social Services Division programs, with the remainder being allocated to the Housing and Community Development Division of the Neighborhoods Department for the provision of rent and utility assistance through existing Housing and Community Development Division programs. The funds may be used for payment of rent, rent arrears, utilities and home energy costs, utilities and home energy costs arrears, and other expenses related to housing incurred by eligible households due, directly or indirectly, to the COVID-19 pandemic.

CM Clark-Murray asked about complaints from recipients from the last round of ERAP funding, and she asked how people apply for this round of funds. Ms. Moore said that there were a handful of complaints, primarily for recipients that had maxed out their allotment of funds. She said that applicants apply through a process routed through 630-City. Daryl Joseph, Parks Director, said that there will be a cap on this round of funds designed to make the assistance available to more people who need it. CM DeFoor extended appreciation for the work done by the Neighborhoods Department to secure the reallocated dollars.

Steve Kelley, DIA, explained the bill.
