AUDITOR RECOMMENDED AMENDMENT

The legislation amends the Ordinance Code to provide for the option to publish certain required notices by electronic methods permitted by law. We recommend that should a department of the City decide to transition from newspaper advertising to electronic advertising (or vice versa) for noticing, filing notice and a copy of the cost comparison required by Florida Statute 50.0311(3) with City Council 30 days prior to the transition shall be required.

- Per section 50.0311(3), Florida Statutes, a governmental agency may use the publicly accessible website of the county in which it lies to publish legally required advertisements and public notices if the cost of publishing advertisements and public notices on such website is less than the cost of publishing advertisements and public notices in a newspaper.
- Per section 50.0311(6), Florida Statutes, a governmental agency that uses a publicly accessible website to publish legally required advertisements and public notices shall provide notice at least once per year in a newspaper of general circulation or another publication that is mailed or delivered to all residents and property owners throughout the government's jurisdiction, indicating that property owners and residents may receive legally required advertisements and public notices from the governmental agency by first-class mail or e-mail upon registering their name and address or e-mail address with the governmental agency.
- The governmental agency shall maintain a registry of names, addresses, and e-mail addresses of property owners and residents who have requested in writing that they receive legally required advertisements and public notices from the governmental agency by first-class mail or e-mail.

- The use of the publicly accessible website will be a department-by-department decision

Carla Lopera, OGC, explained CM Howland's substitute, which adds some departments and circumstances with public notice requirements omitted from the original bill.

CM Howland talked about transparency and the cost savings from online publishing.

Brian Hughes, Mayor's Office, talked about the purpose of the bill and how it is in keeping with Florida Statute 50.0311. He said that the bill does not mandate online public notices, but provides a tool in the toolbox if a department decides to utilize that method.

Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office, explained the recommended amendment.

CM Priestly Jackson asked about a cost analysis. Ms. Carraher said it would be done if/when this is implemented by City, on a case by case basis.

CM Priestly Jackson asked about cost savings for this method. Mr. Hughes described the existing COJ web infrastructure to house the postings, potential cost savings and the augmented online distribution of public notices. CM Priestly Jackson talked about the benefit of impartial 3rd party to distribute notices (Daily Record), and she said she may later proffer an amendment to designate a print-form for notices of CM meetings.

CM Carlucci spoke in opposition of this bill, and said online publishing of notices should be supplemental not a replacement. He mentioned that not all residents are tech savvy, and he emphasized the importance of transparency and accessibility.

CM DeFoor said there is a liability risk from lawsuits based on insufficient notice.

CM Ferraro concurred that online notices should be supplemental.

CM Priestly Jackson said she is not in support of the bill, and she said that cost savings isn't enough of a reason to switch to online notices, and whatever is paid annually to third party publishers is simply the cost of doing business.

CM DeFoor noted the equity issue since not all residents have internet access.

Lacking the requisite 4 votes in either direction (per Council Rules), the bill was deferred.

- Repeals Sec. 116.910 (Residence within the City Preferred) which provides for a preference in employment and retention for Duval County residents
- Creates a new Sec. 116.910 regarding criminal history records checks for prospective and current City employees
- Strikes the salary ranges by pay grade table and references that the information is available on the City's internal website
- Strikes the 3% limit on annual increases to salary ranges authorized by the Director of the Employee Services Department
- Strikes language allowing the Mayor and Sheriff to authorize salary adjustments retroactive to a date within the current fiscal year

Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment, and the Auditor recommended amendments.

CM Ferraro asked for an explanation of the bill, which makes several changes to the *Ordinance Code* related to employee services.

Diane Moser, Director of Employee Services, reviewed the proposed changes to 4 *Ordinance Code* chapters. CM Clark- Murray asked about the change to service raises, currently City employees receive an increase in salary of \$300 per year for every five-year period of continuous service. Ms. Moser said that this bill designates that length of service raises will be for regular full time staff (but not JFRD, JSO or elected officials) in an amount approved through collective bargaining instead of \$300 annually. CM Clark-Murray asked about the new Section 116.910 regarding criminal background checks and how it would be applied to current city staff. Ms. Moser said background checks are utilized for prospective employees and that they would be used for current employees only if there was a position change that required a higher level checking process - like working with a protected class such as the elderly or children.

CM Howland asked about the removal of Duval residency preference in hiring. Ms. Moser said that the removal of the residency the preference is to simplify the employee services vetting process, in that staff may identify qualities that make someone an ideal candidate without having to track down where exactly they may reside. CM Newby proposed a floor amendment to retain the Duval residency preference, and he commented on the number of JSO officers who live outside of the county. The Newby amendment passed unanimously and will be rolled together with the other amendments.
