Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment.

Kirk Wendland, OED, spoke on behalf of the bill which authorizes an economic development agreement and REV grant to develop a 320-unit apartment community on Duval Road within which 96 units (30%) will be reserved for affordable workforce housing.

CM Ferraro asked if there is a standard definition of workforce housing. Mr. Wendland said that it varies, but it is most commonly intended for households with incomes between 80 and 120% of AMI. CM Howland spoke about REV grants, and how they are incentives that discount future property taxes. CM Boylan extended kudos to Mr. Wendland, and for the involvement of the private sector in developing much needed affordable housing units.

#### **CONCERN:**

Through the language in this extension, Waste Pro will have more advantageous results from the Rate Review process than the contracts for the other two hauler service areas creating inequities among haulers and possible additional costs to the City

#### **AUDITOR RECOMMENDED AMENDMENT:**

Revise Rate Review language to be consistent with other hauler agreements in establishing the per premise rate in a Rate Review year as the result of the Rate Review

- Authorizes the fifth amendment to the Amended and Restated Agreement with Waste Pro to:
- Extend the term of the agreement for six years, from September 30, 2023 to September 30, 2029
- Increase the CPI adjustment in years without a rate review from a maximum of 3% to 5%
- Allow Rate per Premise to never decrease as a result of Rate Review
- Waives Code Sec. 382.308(l)(2) (Procedures for extension of contracts) to allow for this contract extension

Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment, Auditor's concern, and the Auditor recommended amendment.

Mr. Peterson said that this extended agreement provides a rate review element that differs from any others in City contracts. He said that in the years when the full rate review is performed the base rate will not be decreased from the previous year's rate even if the agreed upon expenses with mark-up base rate is less than the base rate of the previous year. Mr. Peterson said that historically the rate reviews result in a rate lower than the one in use. The agreement in this bill guarantees that the rate will not decrease regardless of what the review reflects. Mr. Peterson mentioned that the other two waste haulers will likely ask for the same terms for their contracts.

Steve Diebenow, representing Waste Pro, said that Waste Pro can rely on the guaranteed rate for planning purposes and capital investments (trucks etc.).

Eric Fuller and Will Williams, Public Works, spoke on behalf of the bill which extends the hauler contract for 6 more years.

Mr. Ferraro asked about the added costs when the other haulers renew their contracts, and about the overall cost for solid waste services. Mr. Peterson outlined the increasing solid waste deficit (\$18 million currently), in that the portion charged to households does not cover the cost of services (roughly a \$16 gap premise/month). When asked by CM Ferraro, Mr. Fuller said there are about 30 years left at the Trail Ridge landfill before it reaches capacity.

CM Boylan asked when the customer base rate was last changed. Mr. Peterson said it has been the same since 2011.

CM Howland asked about the rate review process, and what can decrease rates since fuel costs are excluded. Mr. Peterson said rates may be revised downwards because of CPI impact. He noted that the fuel surcharge is not included, any depreciation of assets is included, and that the rate also includes 10-15 percent profit rate.

CM Becton, asked about the hauler's rate review requirement, noting that very few cities have that policy. CM Becton said that the review forces the industry to a limited profit margin, and he suggested eliminating the review in the future.

Will Williams said that some pre-bidders are put off by the review requirements and don't bid on contracts.

Steve Diebenow said that his client does not support the Auditor recommended amendment. Motion/2nd move the Auditor recommended amendment Howland/Newby - by hand vote -failed 0-5.

- The nature of the emergency is that the redistricting litigation created confusion and uncertainty regarding the legal boundaries of City Council and School Board Districts in the March 2023 election and the settlement would eliminate that confusion for the upcoming May election and beyond while also bringing this ongoing and expensive litigation to a close.

Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office, explained the nature of the emergency.

Jason Teal, General Counsel, reviewed the redistricting and litigation history, and the settlement negotiations. The settlement agreement adopts the P3 map until the next redistricting and resolves the attorney fees issue (as a civil rights lawsuit the plaintiff is entitled to ask for attorney's fees). Mr. Teal said the initial plaintiff attorney fee offer was \$1 million, which was reduced to \$100,000 in settlement discussions with the plaintiffs. This settlement is not final until adopted by the courts, and it will show that the map was adopted by way of litigation so the City does not have to repeat the redistricting process. Mr. Teal also said that the plaintiff reserves the right to, and may ask for, two school board district (4,6) elections be held off cycle in special elections in 2024, which the City vehemently opposes. CM Boylan asked if there was notation in the lawsuit settlement that indicates the City acted in bad faith, and Mr. Teal said no, that the settlement reflects that the maps were based on mistakes made when drawing maps decades ago.

CM Howland is begrudgingly supportive of the settlement to save on future costs, and because the new incoming council members will be based on the P3 map districts.

CM Boylan recommended that OGC make a list of lessons learned in this process for next time.

CM Becton commented about the previous map, the imperfection of the redistricting process, and how in his opinion the old map was not unconstitutional.

CM Newby concurred with CM Becton and Howland, and commented on the diversity of council members.
