JTA Presentation

Greer Johnson-Gillis, Senior Vice President of Infrastructure and System Development with JTA, gave updates on a number of JTA projects. In the Mobility Works I initiative all projects should be completed by 2024: the Parramore Road project will be complete by Thanksgiving; the 5th and McDuff Avenue project should be completed by the end of the year; the Alta Drive project should be complete in November 2023; and the San Pablo Road improvements should be completed by March of 2024.

JTA's MOVE 2027 5-year plan has been completed after considerable public and stakeholder input in Jacksonville and adjacent counties. The plan covers 7 strategic areas: workforce development regional expansion, the Emerald Trail, sustainability, Transit Oriented Development, Ultimate Urban Circulator (U2C), and First Coast commuter rail. A new MyJTA app will debut soon with enhanced information on all facets of transit, including ticket purchases, scheduling information, real-time vehicle locator, etc. JTA is working on 17 local option gas tax projects, including bus rapid transit (BRT) improvements, ADA improvements at bus stops, a second vessel for the St. Johns River Ferry, the Emerald Trail, and 10 complete streets projects. JTA will be responsible for constructing about half of the 30-mile Emerald Trail system through its agreements with the City and Groundwork Jacksonville. A big part of the Mobility Works II local option gas tax projects will be a substantial workforce development program in areas beyond just construction jobs. JTA has received a \$15.4 million grant to replace diesel buses with natural gas buses and to construct charging stations for 6 electric vehicles, and has received a \$1.72 million grant to begin planning for extension of the U2C system into neighborhoods adjacent to downtown on the Northbank and Southbank.

CM Morgan asked about the conversion from fossil fuel to electric vehicles and the impact that may have on gas tax collections and the ability to successfully complete local option gas tax projects. Ms. Gillis said that JTA's budget projections take the growth of EVs and the reduction in gas sales into account. CM Cumber asked how many of the 7,000 new jobs created that were mentioned earlier were direct vs. indirect jobs. Ms. Gillis said JTA's analysis projects 2,000 direct jobs from City-funded JTA projects and said she would provide more information on how that figure was calculated. Ms. Cumber also inquired about whether the jobs would be hiring persons not currently working or would be transfers of people already employed elsewhere. CM Bowman complimented JTA on their community outreach regarding the San Pablo Road project which seems to have gone very smoothly and the community has been very well-informed, and questions have been promptly addressed.
