**Jacksonville Port Authority Presentation**

Beth McCague, CFO of the Jacksonville Port Authority, said 2022 was a great year for JaxPort. The authority does an economic impact study every 5 years and the next edition will be done later this year. The 2018 study found that JaxPort’s operations produce 26,000 jobs and \$31 billion in economic impact. JaxPort is Florida’s busiest container port and the 10th busiest in the US, seeing a 25% increase in container traffic since 2017. JaxPort is the primary U.S. port for trade with Puerto Rico. JaxPort is also one of the most diverse ports in the U.S. for its variety of cargo – 50% containers, 25% roll-on/roll-off (RO/RO) vehicles, and the remainder split among breakbulk, liquid bulk materials, military cargo, and cruise ship passengers. Logistics Magazine last year gave JaxPort 2 big awards – best value port nationally and best customer service on the East Coast. The port is a world leader in export of liquified natural gas (LNG), and is one of the few ports to provide LNG fueling of ships. The intermodal container transfer facility (railyard on Dames Point) takes thousands of trucks off the roads by moving containers directly from ship to rail for transport. A brand new, larger Southeast Toyota vehicle processing facility will be opening on Blount Island, moving from the Talleyrand terminal. The authority is improving 2 berths at Blount Island to handle the increased RO/RO traffic and larger car carrier ships. A new 150,000 square foot warehouse is being built at the Talleyrand West facility and a new facility being built by port tenant SSA is underway at Talleyrand including 3 new electric cranes. JaxPort is also getting ready to raise the JEA transmission lines over the river and Mill Cove to provide greater height clearance for larger ships. The harbor deepening has attracted new, larger ships and additional shipping lines.

Ed Linsky of the Council Auditor's Office explained the Finance Committee amendment. Bill Killingsworth, Director of Planning and Development, reviewed the four components of the mobility fee. The revisions provide for differing fees by zone for the cost per vehicle miles traveled based on the number of projects pending in each mobility zone. The trip adjustment calculation is now done automatically by the model rather than being manually calculated by staff. Jacksonville's new maximum mobility fee is less than in St. Johns and Clay counties and slightly more than Nassau County, and is just under the state and national averages.
