Jacksonville Aviation Authority Presentation

Mark VanLoh, CEO of the Jacksonville Aviation Authority (JAA), said all 4 airports are doing very well. Travel in February set a record for most passengers ever flying out of Jacksonville International Airport in a month and March looks to be the same pace. Work is ongoing at JIA at the TSA checkpoint area at night, trying to minimize inconvenience to travelers during the day. Those improvements will double the speed of passenger screening when completed. The JAA just had a groundbreaking at Cecil Field for another new Boeing facility. Employment is growing at the airports and they are having good success at hiring, unlike lots of other employers in the current economy. Council Member Carlucci praised the traveling experience through JIA. Council Member DeFoor asked about the authority's finances and direct flight cities. Mr. VanLoh said revenue this year is exceeding budget and a number of new non-stop cities have been added in the last year. Phoenix, San Francisco and Seattle are the target cities for additional non-stop service, and Jacksonville is the largest city on the US east coast that does not have direct service to London, which is the top international target. Council Member Bowman noted that modifications are being made to the Florida Air National Guard base at JIA to accommodate F-35 aircraft, the top US fighter jet replacing the current generation of F-15s. Mr. Bowman also said that the Tourist Development Council at its last meeting allocated \$1 million for marketing and promotion to assist in developing non-stop flights from JIA to the United Kingdom. In response to a question from Chairwoman Pittman, Mr. VanLoh said that the JAA is rigorous in training its employees on cyber security.

Florida Department of Transportation Presentation-

Nathan Pick in the public information office of FDOT District 2 gave a report on ongoing and upcoming projects in Jacksonville. The huge I-95/I-10 interchange project will be done later this year. Moncrief Creek bridge reconstruction will be done this spring. I-10/US 301 interchange improvements will be done by the end of the year. New projects beginning this year include: Arlington Expressway resurfacing and service road and pedestrian improvements; Edgewood Avenue lighting improvements; I-295 from Beach Boulevard to Butler Boulevard repaving and widening starts this summer; I-95 from Baymeadows to Butler Boulevard widening and interchange improvements; Edgewood Avenue south improvements will start in late summer; Butler Boulevard and Kernan Boulevard interchange improvements are underway; an I-95 and Martin Luther King Jr. Expressway interchange project will start later in the summer; lighting improvements on Lem Turner Road from I-95 to Edgewood Avenue will start later this year. In all, over \$600 million in new construction and maintenance projects will be started in Jacksonville in 2023.

Council Auditor's Office Summary Bill 2023-184 – MOSH

Summary:

• Authorizing a redevelopment agreement (RDA) between the City and the Museum of Science and History of Jacksonville (MOSH) to facilitate the construction of a new "iconic" and integrated museum to be located on City owned property within the Shipyards area

MOSH Contribution:

- Construction of new "iconic" museum, requiring:
 - Minimum capital investment of \$85,000,000
 - Minimum enclosed space of 75,000 square feet
 - Minimum exhibit and gallery space of 50,000 square feet
- Maintenance of 1.5 acres joint-use park (excluding capital maintenance)
- Design surrounding park (reimbursable up to \$880,000 by City)

City Contribution:

- 40 year, 2.5 acre ground lease (unimproved land) at a rate of \$1 per year
 - One extension option of 10 years
- Non-exclusive use of 1.5 acres of adjacent park area
- Related future City Construction (current appropriation available of \$19.8 million)
 - Road and Utility Infrastructure (extending A. Philip Randolph to the project site)
 - Riverwalk Improvements
 - Park Improvements

Performance Schedule:

- Executed Park Design agreement within 6 months of RDA effective date
- Satisfy Museum Ground Lease prerequisites, including Funding Milestone (\$40,000,000), execute Museum Ground Lease, and commence Museum Improvements by 12/31/23
- Complete Park Design by 9/30/24
- Complete Museum Improvements by 12/31/27
- DIA CEO may extend the performance schedule by 6 months and an additional 6 month extension is allowed with DIA Board approval

COMMENTS:

- There are no specifically stated penalties in the Redevelopment Agreement, besides general default, to address a failure by MOSH to meet the minimum development requirements
- While MOSH is prohibited from utilizing City funding to meet the requirements of the Funding Milestone (\$40 million), there are no similar prohibitions related to reaching the full \$85 million minimum capital investment
- •The Jaguars must agree to reduce or accept alternate parking as part of their lease with the City prior to closing on the Museum Parcel

ROI - DIA has calculated a 20-year ROI of 0.35
