• Closure requested to allow for a mixed-use development on the adjacent parcels

Steve Diebenow, speaking on behalf of the project developer, circulated two maps highlighting the proposed changes to the alleyway. The first map, illustrated the original proposal to close the northern half and the western entirety of the alley. However, this proposal was revised due to comments from three stakeholders: Lori Boyer from the DIA, Bellsouth due to a telephone line that ran through the area, and CM Cumber. In response, Mr. Diebenow presented a revised application, shown in the second map representing the western part of the alleyway alone. They proposed an easement for Bellsouth's telephone line, which they would bury underground at their own expense, and amended the closure to only the western part of the alley, maintaining access to properties to the north and south. This revised proposal was designed to address concerns about limiting downtown grid network access.

Michael Saylor spoke in favor of the project.

Devon Hardy spoke in opposition to the project. Pam Sorenson spoke in opposition to the project and provided a handout. Jeff Schembera did not speak but was in opposition to the project. Andrea Mims spoke in opposition to the project. Lauren Carlucci spoke in opposition to the project. Liz Figura spoke in opposition to the project. Steve Tunstill spoke in opposition to the project. Montelle Trammell spoke in opposition to the project. Leslie Deleo, Chase Sorenson, Sonia Vivian, StephenGahan, Vicki Tunstill, Gianni Vivian, John Fradd, Victoria Hurd, Sandra Fradd, and Jonas Loh all did not speak but were in opposition to the project.

Steve Diebenow requested to respond to public comments, after which CM Cumber raised a point of order saying rebuttals have previously not been allowed to public comments. Chairwoman Pittman sought advice from Mary Staffopolous of the Office of General Counsel, who clarified that it was allowed at the Chair's discretion. Mr. Diebenow was granted permission to rebut, followed by a response from the residents.

Mr. Diebenow argued that the alleyway's safety would improve if brought up to code with wider sidewalks, as required by the DIA and DDRB. He stated the traffic detour mentioned by the residents would remain unaffected by the ordinance. In response, Steve Tunstill, representing the residents, contended that the alleyway serves a significant purpose, demonstrated by the morning traffic detour. He emphasized the alleyway's essential role in the community and its potential for beneficial development. Mr. Tunstill expressed concerns about the proposed site project, predicting an influx of moving trucks that would increase traffic and compromise safety.

CM Cumber argued that the proposed alleyway closure and development would create an excessively large block, contrary to historic neighborhoods' preferences. She cited older southern cities revitalized through alleyway rehabilitation and pedestrian conversion, improving city dynamics. CM Cumber expressed concerns about traffic implications and urged a vote against the ordinance.

CM Carlucci, stressed the significance of alleyways for parking and public safety, citing his past work on the subject, and questioned the rationale for voting on the alleyway closure before approving the entire project.

CM DeFoor initially favored the closure, believing the alleyway was only used for parking. However, learning about its role in traffic diversion changed her stance. CM DeFoor emphasized that issues related to alleyways also exist in CM Gaffney Jr.'s district.

CM Gaffney Jr. sought an understanding of the advantages and disadvantages of closing or keeping the alleyway open and the implications if the project was approved but the alleyway remained accessible. Mr. Diebenow clarified that the project would be discussed first at the full City Council meeting, followed by the alleyway ordinance.

Chairwoman Pittman asserted the importance of residents' views and her inability to support the ordinance in the committee. The motion was denied with a 1-5 vote (Bowman).

Ed Linsky, from the Council Auditors Office, read the substitute for the bill. The committee approved the substitute.

CM Carlucci said that the bill would help people who would not otherwise be able to buy endangered properties or repair these properties by providing financial tools. It sets up a designated fund to receive city funds, adding that the Council's Strategic Plan has already set aside \$500,000 for that purpose. CM Carlucci added that the bill is similar to the one which protects downtown buildings but extends it to the rest of the county and outlined the requirements. He also encouraged other Councilmembers who may want to co-sponsor to do so.

CM Cumber asked if she and CM Carlucci could work together to ensure that the funds go to those who need it, and not those who can already afford to do the repairs and purchases either way. CM Carlucci agreed and said that he would try to set up a noticed meeting on the issue. CM Cumber then requested to be added as a co-sponsor to the bill. CM Gaffney Jr. also asked to be added as a co-sponsor. The committee then voted to substitute and rerefer the bill.

Ed Linsky, from the Council Auditors Office, read the amendment. CM Danny Becton said he introduced the bill on behalf of his constituents, the students, and the Principal of Atlantic Coast High School, as well as the School Advisory Committee of Atlantic Coast High School. He outlined the proposed name change of the road and mentioned that the Skinner family was on board with the project but did have two concerns: 1) that the Council in the future would never subdivide more of the roadway, and 2) that they wanted to memorialize Richard and Annie Skinner. CM Becton addressed the first concern, stating that he did not see the Council further subdividing the road in the future. He added that he liked the idea of a plaque for the Skinner family. The only issue with the plaque was the financial component. CM Becton was able to find unused district funds of \$3,770 to provide funding for the plaque but fell short of the total cost by \$500. He then introduced Ramon Day, who offered to cover the remaining cost.

CMs Aaron Bowman, Matt Carlucci, and Randy DeFoor asked to be added as co-sponsors.

Ramon Day made a public comment thanking the committee for taking action on the bill and gave background to the origination of the bill.
